Restaurant Review - Smoque BBQ

Our little neighborhood might not seem the kind of place to find great barbecue. But it is now with the opening of the restaurant Smoque.

The unfortunately-spelled restaurant has the kind of brisket you would find in the best joints in Texas, ribs that would be at home in St. Louis or Memphis and pulled pork that can compete with the Carolinas' top stuff.

It's all reasonably priced, too.

Located at the northwest corner of Pulaski Road and West Grace Street, Smoque offers slow-cooked food done right. The brisket — a difficult piece of meat to cook for many amateur barbecuers — is tender and juicy. It has just the right amount of smoky flavor.

Smoque offers two kinds of ribs: traditional baby backs and drier St. Louis ribs. Both offer great flavor and meat that pretty much falls off the bone. And if the rub — the spice rubbed into the meat — is not to your liking, Smoque's sauce allows you make the ribs a bit more conventional.

My son 8-year-old Michael, a connoisseur in training of what he calls "smoked-up ribs," has tried both and says each is a winning dining experience.

As for the pulled pork, it, too, is true to its culinary roots. As a former resident of North Carolina, I made an avocation of sorts of barbecue, and Smoque's pulled pork would do North or South Carolina barbecuers proud.

You can't have the full Carolina experience, though. There, a sliced or chopped pulled pork sandwich would be piled high with a tangy, reddish slaw. Smoque's is decidedly white, though tasty indeed.

In addition to the slaw, Smoque's menu offers a salad and a handful of sides. The fries, which come in a brown bag, are hand-cut and very good, as is the mac and cheese, which is the best bet on the children's menu for those kids who don't yet have a taste for q. Smoque also serves chicken.

The standout among the sides, my wife and I decided, are the barbecue beans. Smoky, with a good helping of onions, they were some of the best we had ever tasted. They persuaded us that the cooks at Smoque were willing to serve up something a little unfamiliar to find a winning combination. The mini peach cobbler, which is served in a small round tin, is a great way to top off your meal at Smoque and send you straight to the sofa.

Smoque has a sparsely appointed dining room that is kid-friendly and that fills quickly, especially on weekends. It also offers carry-out and catering.

The staff clearly is working out a few kinks, probably caused by being a little busier than they expected so soon. On our second visit, the restaurant was temporarily out of the mac and cheese — a big disappointment to our Jack — and the St. Louis ribs.

But it was really no worry. There's so much on the menu.


The City of Chicago has teamed up with Northern Illinois Energy Project and the Midwest Energy Efficiency Alliance to promote money saving **compact fluorescent light (CFL)**

bulbs. These light bulbs use up to 66% less energy to create the same amount of light and last up to 10 times longer than an incandescent light bulb, therefore saving an average of \$30 over the lifetime of each bulb. We now have **CFL bulbs available here at our public service office.** These CFL bulbs are the equivalent of 60-watt incandescent bulbs, and are free for residents of the 39th Ward (while supplies last).

Also, if you are interested in having a tree planted in the parkway in front of your home, please contact my public service office. Tree planting in the parkway is a free service offered by the City of Chicago, but it is only done in the spring and fall (weather-permitting).

Driving Tips for Teens

Lack of experience puts teenagers at a greater risk of being involved or dying in a car accident. The more you practice, the better you will handle different situations on the road. Following are a few extra tips for safe driving:

- Drive Sober (the BAC limit for persons under 21 is .00)
- · Ride with sober drivers
- · Always wear your seatbelt
- Get to know your car
- · Be a defensive driver
- Stay alert
- Focus on your driving; avoid distractions
- Don't load up your car with more passengers than allowed by law
- Don't get stressed out
- Check your rearview mirror before and after you brake
- Follow all traffic safety rules

- Don't drive faster than you can handle, and don't exceed the posted speed limit
- Never let friends drive your car

Tips for Parents

The Graduated Driver Licensing System requires parents to spend 50 Hours in the car with their teenagers behind the wheel. Encourage your teenager to develop safe driving habits and skills.

- Take your teenager for driving practice under various conditions and practice different skills
- Take your teenager to a license only when you and your teenager feel the time is right
- Set a good example when you drive
- Provide a safe vehicle for practice sessions
- Work with your teenager's driver education instructor
- Meet with your insurance agent
- Create a sober driving contract
- Inform your teen what to do in case of an accident


