WWCA - General Meeting Minutes - April 17, 2007 - 26 present

WWCA Vice-President Evan Price opened the meeting at 7:31 p.m..

The first order of business was a talk by Bill Dugan a/k/a The Fish Guy from the Fish Guy Market at 4423 N. Elston. Bill has been a West Walker resident for years and advocates fresh, sustainable food sources, both on land and sea. He has many weekly specials, including Family Wednesdays and Ten Buck Tuesdays (catch of the day at a discounted price). He even turns the store into a restaurant once a month called Wellfleet for a special and unusual night out. Read more at www.fishguy.com.

Jack Prikos of the Farmer's Market Garden Center was present to give a timely presentation on the Market and answer questions about gardening. Jack was very excited about improvements at the Market and their emphasis on quality products and outstanding service. He has cultivated relationships with local vendors to ensure quality plants of all types, including new varieties which have better disease and insect resistance. New personnel have also been brought in to handle landscape and design needs of the Market's customers. Jack is also a West Walker resident and encourages people to stop in at the Market at 4110 N. Elston.

Moises Correa of That Strip Joynt was also in attendance, Moises has recently moved to 4176 N. Elston from farther south on Elston. Moises has been in the wood stripping business for 30 years and was present to answers questions about his new location. He informed us that his wood restoration business catered mostly to home renovators and that he had plans to improve his newly purchased property at 4176 N. Elston with new equipment and fencing. He has been working with the Alderman's office to address any concerns and hopes to be a good neighbor.

The March General Meeting Minutes were approved.

Treasurer Bob Begeske reported a general account balance of \$2,283.85. Bob also reported that West Walker received an anonymous donation of \$500.00, which is greatly appreciated.

Evan Price reported that the Vision Committee is coordinating West Walker's participation in the Creative Chicago Expo on April 21, which helps match neighborhoods with various artistic and creative people and organizations.

The second annual WWCA Build-A-Bag event to benefit the Irving Park Community Food Pantry is April 22 at the Lutheran Church gym.

Safe Neighborhoods has held a meeting to discuss traffic issues with Alderman Laurino's office and Commander Dulay. Further meetings are being scheduled to address neighborhood concerns regarding traffic and enforcement.

A second meeting has been set to discuss the development of the old C. Manny's property at 4154 N. Elston, which will be reviewed and considered in cooperation with the Alderman's Office in the near future.

The Mayor's Clean and Green Day is Saturday, May 5. Alderman Laurino's office can be contacted for more information and supplies, including compact florescent lights.

WWCA Officer Responsibilities - If you've ever wondered what exactly your West Walker Civic Association officers do, here's a brief description gleaned from the WWCA constitution and by-laws.

The President presides at all meetings of the association and executive board, and casts a deciding vote in case of a tie. The officer also appoints the Nominating Committee and the chairs of other committees, other than those headed by the Past President and by current officers.

The Vice President assists the president in performing those duties. In the president's absence, the vice-president presides at meetings and fulfills the president's other responsibilities.

The Secretary keeps minutes of association meetings, maintains a record of WWCA business, and conducts other WWCA correspondence as directed by the association. The office is also technically responsible for notifying members of WWCA meetings.

The Treasurer keeps accurate membership and auditable financial records. He or she disburses money according to spending limits approved by the Executive Board.

CAPS Update: Beat 1723


CAPS (Chicago Alternative Policing Strategy) meetings for 2007 for our beat are held at the 17th District in the community Room, 4650 N. Pulaski. Meetings begin at 7:00 p.m. monthly on the 3rd Wednesday and typically last one hour.

José Murphy from the Department of Buildings reported on several problem properties and noted the progress made

addressing the concerns. Several properties on N. Monticello have been reported as buildings with gang and drug activity. There were over 25 complaints made about the two properties, two of which were code violations.

There was additional discussion about illegal auto repair and sales at 4419 N. Springfield and in the surrounding vicinity. It was mentioned how difficult it is to catch these types of operations—mainly back alley mechanics. If you see any suspicious activity call 911.

Police cameras have been a regular topic at the CAPS meeting and this month was no different. A resident mentioned a recent crime (outside the West Walker area) and asked if the installation of police cameras



can share ideas and information, and become better acquainted, which in turn builds and strengthens neighborhoods. Block clubs also can help reduce crime. When neighbors organize and collectively address issues and concerns, they can achieve most anything. The next block club training is in the 17th district station community room at 4560 N. Pulaski from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on Saturday, May 19. For more information, contact Chris Wright at Christopher. Wright@chicagopolice.org or 312/742-0961.

Now that construction season has begun, I would like to remind you once again that the **Irving Park streetscape** will continue with work between Pulaski and Tripp. This project is scheduled to be complete by the end of the construction season.

Once again, on **Monday, June 4th**, the City Clerk's office will be selling **City Vehicle Stickers** and **Residential Permit Parking Stickers** here in my public service office. Stickers will be sold from **10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.** The City Clerk's Office requests that everyone bring the

following information so that the line moves along quickly and smoothly: your phone number, drivers license, and license plate number. They will not be accepting debit or credit cards.


The City of Chicago is offering **Compact Fluorescent Light Bulbs (CFL)** to city residents. We still have these **CFL bulbs available here at our public service office**. These CFL bulbs are the equivalent of 60-watt incandescent bulbs, and are free for residents of the 39th Ward (while supplies last).

Also, the Department of Streets and Sanitation has begun **Street Sweeping** on residential streets. Street sweeping occurs on weekdays between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Please keep an eye out for those bright orange 'No Parking' signs on light poles and trees on your block. Failing to comply with parking restrictions for street sweeping can result in a \$50.00 citation.






IPAC Seeks Members

Attention Seniors and Illinois Cares Rx Users

Recently the Department of Healthcare and Family Services increased the Illinois Cares Rx income limits. Many of you may have been denied due to over income limits. If you have been denied for over income guidelines, your application will be reprocessed under the new income limits. The new income guides are in effect now and are as follows:



Illinois Cares Rx Basic:

- \$22,793 for a household of one
- \$30.594 for a household of two
- \$38,393 for a household of three

Illinois Cares Rx Plus:

- \$21,936 for a household of one
- \$29.412 for a household of two

The income limits increases impact Illinois Cares Rx drug coverage only. The income limits for the Circuit Breaker property tax grant and license plate discount have not changed. If you haven't applied for Illinois Cares Rx drug coverage this year because your income was over the limit, apply now. You may apply online at www.cbrx.il.gov or contact the Senior Helpline at 1-800-252-8966 or 1-888-206-1327 (TTY) to request a paper application.




