Be A Good Neighbor - Clear Your Sidewalks This Winter!

Now that mother nature has hit us with her abundance of snowfall, and we have several more months of snow to look forward to, don't forget to be a good neighbor and clear your sidewalks.

Chicago Municipal Code holds property owners responsible for clearing the sidewalks bordering their properties after any significant snowfall. With local groceries in the neighborhood and the availability of public transportation, we have a lot of foot traffic in West Walker. Clearing sidewalks eases the way for those making their way through the area on foot. Also, if you have elderly or sick neighbors who are unable to adhere to the municipal code, please consider clearing their walks for them - you'll be a doubly good neighbor (to those who can't clear the walks, and to those thankful walkers who need to use the sidewalk).

Clear walks also helps keep walkers off the street - an often used option for many folks on foot when walks aren't clear and are too treacherous to maneuver.

Living Next to the Great Lakes

Welcome to 2009! Let's hope this is a great year for you, and also the Environment!

I think about water a lot of the time. That may seem odd, at this time of the year, when ice and snow are more prevalent, but this is a good time to think about indoor projects, and prepare for spring planting.

We live next to one of the greatest fresh water resources on the planet – 90% of the fresh water in the United States, and nearly 20% of the fresh water in the entire world!

In October of 2008, the Great Lakes Compact was signed into law by the President. This agreement, signed by all of the states bordering the Great Lakes, including Canada, and fully ratified by Congress, protects the Great Lakes from large withdrawals of water by other, drier states or counties outside the Basin, or even foreign countries.

What we, as residents of the Great Lakes Basin have a responsibility to commit to, along with all the various cities and municipalities that exist along the lakefront areas, is our own effort to conserve and protect the resource.

So what can individuals do to help?

Conserving and protecting the resource means using less, and using more wisely.

Start by getting a water meter installed. Once you measure how much you actually use, conserving gets much easier! I did this last July, and my water bill is nearly 6 times smaller! If you call 311, they will give you the name of an engineer at the City who can get a meter installed for you free of charge.

Install low-flow shower heads, and faucets — a small insert can be purchased for a faucet at most hardware stores. If remodeling, select a low-flush toilet. While everyone loves a hot tub or shower, try not to run the water for hours at a time. Turn off the water when brushing your teeth. Find a good drip irrigation system for the garden so as not to need to run sprays all summer — and don't forget to install a rain barrel this coming year, if you haven't already!

Water is a very precious resource – we should all do our bit to save it.


Community Garden Planning Meeting - January 31st

The garden will be located at 4107 N. Pulaski, which is presently a vacant lot owned by the Irving Park Lutheran Church. The church congregation has given permission to Carlson Ministries to use the land for a minimum of three years. Volunteers will plant, maintain and harvest the vegetable garden, the proceeds of which will be donated to the Irving Park Food Pantry. Volunteers will have an opportunity to share in the harvest as well.

At the meeting on January 31st, the community is invited to view plans for the garden, hear about volunteer opportunities and how the garden will be run, and offer input. All are welcome to attend. Refreshments will be served.

Bungalow Update

A group of about 25 community members, representatives from the Chicago Park District, Bailey Edward Design, and various city departments met in December to meet the newly-hired architect for the Independence Park Bungalow Renovation Project and hear updates about the project.

Brendan Daley, the Chicago Park District's project manager assigned to the Bungalow, explained the steps his office took which lead to the hiring of the architect for the project's design and construction administration. The multi-step process began in August 2008 and concluded with the hiring of Bailey Edwards Design in December.

According to Daley, the general scope of the project includes renovating the bungalow, garage, and immediate surrounding grounds of the building. Specific projects include repairing and restoring the roof; restoring windows and doors; putting in a new mechanical system for increase efficiency; upgrading systems – plumbing, electricity, gas, etc. And all of this will be done while both maintaining consistency with historic bungalow design and executing green design.

Daley hopes that construction will begin in late spring/early summer. The park district hopes to use the bungalow as a demonstration tool for green building education, showcasing elements of the design in an easily visible manner.

Daley thanked the community for its commitment to fundraising and said that once construction begins, they will have a better idea of what things cost and how to allocate the Park District's budget for the project.


Robyn Whitehurst and Greg Williams from Bailey Edward Design spoke briefly about Bailey Edward Design's experience – 17 years – and expertise – restoration, residential and green projects for the state of Illinois and others. BED specializes in adaptive reuse, windows, and community-involved projects. BED has done several residential bungalow restoration/renovations. Robyn Whitehurst, a principal of the firm will serve as project manager. Greg Williams, his colleague, is the "project captain."

Margaret Laurino, 39th Ward Alderman, announced that the department of Environment had awarded the project a \$100,000 grant to build a geo-thermal heating/cooling system. Part of a settlement with People's Energy, the grant allows the project to dig 700 feet into the ground to heat/cool the building through geo-thermal gas and a heat exchanger.

An officer from the Internal Affairs department was there to give a brief presentation covering two specific areas — racial profiling and filing a complaint or compliment. The Chicago Police Department strictly prohibits racial profiling* as the sole reason for questioning or stopping a citizen and all officers are expected to follow department guidelines around profiling. If you want to file a complaint or compliment an officer you can call the Independent Police Review Authority at 312-745-3594 or visit www.IPRAChicago.org.

*Racial Profiling — any arrest, detention, interdiction, or other law enforcement action that is based solely on the actual or perceived race, ethnicity, color, national origin or ancestry of the targeted person.

<u> Office Report: 39th Ward</u>

I hope everyone in the West Walker community enjoyed a happy holiday season. Although it's only January, winter has already taken a toll. The first snow storms of the season brought a barrage of complaints about the lack of plowing and salting of city streets. It appears that the city has resolved some of these problems and has stepped up their efforts. Now we're faced with more and more potholes on the streets. If you see potholes in the neighborhood, I encourage you to call my office (773-736-5594) with the exact location and my staff will log it in the city's system.

As you know, Congressman Rahm Emanuel has resigned to become President Obama's Chief of Staff. His departure in the 5th Congressional District requires a special election be held to fill the vacancy. The date of the **Primary Election is Tuesday, March 3** and the **General Election is Tuesday, April 7**.

If you're thinking about replacing your sidewalks this year, consider applying for the city's **Shared Cost Sidewalk Program**. Through the Shared Cost Program, the city and property owners share the cost of sidewalk improvements, resulting in a substantial savings to property owners. Applications will only be accepted through the city's 311 system. To apply to the program, just call 311 and an operator will enter your information. Since this is a first come, first served program, if you are interested the Shared Cost Program I suggest applying as soon as possible. In previous years, demand has exceeded the program's capacity. When this happens, the city will close the application process for 2009.


