WWCA General Meeting Minutes

From March 16, 2010

The meeting was called to order at 7:39 p.m. December minutes were approved as presented in the January issue of the *Wire*.

Greg Petersen, a health psychologist with Swedish Covenant Hospital, spoke about stress. Signs of too much stress include short-term memory loss, difficulty making decisions, and no interest in activities. To reduce stress, try moving in a direction you feel positive about.

The treasurer reported that the current balance in the WWCA checking account is \$1,354.15.

State Rep. Deb Mell left information on Gov. Quinn's budget, menu labeling legislation, and more.

There is now a bench at the Irving Park Metra station. This was installed because of resident phone calls, so keep calling.

PEBA/Lawrence TIF is interviewing developers and

asking them how to revitalize the area. Developers said they are happy with this area and are waiting for the economy to change and then they will develop here. Bike lanes and wide sidewalks on Elston are attractive for businesses.

From the floor: We should look at area massage parlors. Marvin Weinstein reported that an area business is seeking a liquor license, which is being handled through the proper liquor licensing channels.

The IPAC Spaghetti Dinner is on April 17 from 5 to 8 p.m. at the Independence Park Fieldhouse.

CAPS Report

THERE WAS NO MARCH MEETING for Beat 1723. Instead, Commander Michael Mealer hosted a town hall meeting for all beats within the 17th District. It was held at the Salvation Army Headquarters on Pulaski Road. About 200 people attended the meeting, which included a table-top information fair for local non-profits and community organizations, including the West Walker Civic Association.

Commander Mealer gave an overview of the 17th

District in a Power Point presentation. The 17th District comprises 9.62 miles and a population of 157,000. Reports of community concerns often result in multiple visits from officers. The highest number of community concerns came from Beat 1723—the beat that covers West Walker. Community concerns can be reported online at http://chicagopolice.org.

The commander reported that incidents of crime are down for the first quarter from one year ago. In 2009, there were 13 homicides in the 17th District—an unusually high number. So far in 2010 there have been 0 homicides. Looking ahead, Commander Mealer said to expect many more "Community Alert" type communications. The commander cautioned that an increase in these types of alerts does not reflect an increase in crime, just in the way it is reported. Mealer stated that crime overall is down in the 17th District from when he took command.

The commander presented community service awards to seven Albany Park businesses and organizations. Entertainment was provided by dancers from the Thai Cultural Center. The meeting closed with questions from the audience.

39th Ward Report



THE DEPARTMENT of Streets and Sanitation recently announced that they are changing the way they schedule street sweeping. Street sweeping, previously scheduled in a grid system within every ward, will switch to a citywide district grid system.

Under the new system, street sweeping will start on the eastern and western edges of the city and move to the center. This means that the 39th Ward will be getting its first round of street sweeping in mid-May. I have been told that this new method of providing street sweeping will not affect the level of services we have had in past years. My 39th Ward superintendent, Tony LaPash, and I will be closely monitoring the new system.

We can get a jump start on the street sweeping with the **39th Ward Clean and Green on Saturday, April 17**. For more than 20 years, the city has teamed up with community groups to beautify neighborhoods by cleaning and recycling accumulated litter and trash. We will provide community groups with all the brooms, rakes, shovels, and bags needed to get the jobs done. If you are interested in participating, please contact Jonathan in my office at 773.736.5594.

Although we have seen some delays in city services due to budget cuts and furloughs, one of the services that has remained the most consistent is tree planting. If you would like to have a tree planted in your parkway, I encourage you to contact my office.


This summer, our theme is called "Baobab Blast!" Found in Africa, the baobab is an enormous tree that creates its



Cook County Children Hurting

To ensure their efforts are targeted most effectively, the Greater Chicago Food Depository and Feeding America, the nation's largest domestic hunger-relief organization, recently conducted a study of child hunger and nutrition in Cook County. Among the findings:

- Overall, 45 percent of children missed a main meal in the previous 24 hours.
- 15 percent of children did not eat breakfast, 23 percent did not eat lunch, and 15 percent did not eat dinner.
- In no main food group (fruits, vegetables, grains, dairy, proteins) did even half of the children meet the federal Recommended Daily Allowance. Only 0.7 percent met the RDA for all five food groups.
- Overall, food served through the out-of-school program was healthier than that served at home, and out-of-school programs had a significant impact on fruit and vegetable consumption.
- The Chicago communities with the highest number of unserved children on an average day were: Austin, Belmont, Cragin, the Near West Side, South Lawndale, and West Town.

Irving Park Carlson Ministries Is Now Carlson Community Services

Irving Park Carlson Ministries, a 501(c)(3) non-profit located in the West Walker neighborhood, has recently changed its name to Carlson Community Services (CCS). The board of directors of Carlson began considering a name change when feedback from the community revealed a perception that Irving Park Carlson Ministries was a religious organization. The new name better reflects the organization's welcome to both community and church members.

"The inclusion of the word 'Ministries' in our name was a source of confusion for some people," said Board Chair Richard Wielock. "Although Carlson Community Services was founded by the Irving Park Lutheran Church and receives a portion of its funding from the church, the two organizations are separate. "We provide programs and services to people of all faiths and no faith," he said.

Carlson sponsors the Magic After-School Place, the Three Brothers Garden, which supports the Irving Park Food Pantry with donations of fresh produce, the Irving Park Fine Arts

Committee, and Wildest Dreams women's cancer support group. Its annual operating budget is approximately \$60,000. Oversight is provided by a board of directors made up of Irving Park Lutheran Church members and members of the community. CCS remains closely affiliated with the church, which provides space for CCS programs.

How "Walkable" Is West Walker?

AS THE WEATHER warms up, it's time to dust off the bicycle and get the tires pumped up. If you've been riding your bike all winter, good for you! It's time also to haul out the walking shoes, if you aren't already taking the bus or the train to work.

Some of the things to look for in a great, walkable neighborhood are the following (excerpted from the website http://www.walkscore.com):

- Street width and block length: Narrow streets slow down traffic. Short blocks provide more routes to the same destination and make it easier to take a direct route.
- Street design: Sidewalks and safe crossings are essential to walkability. Appropriate automobile speeds, trees, and other features also help.
- Freeways and bodies of water: Freeways can divide neighborhoods. Swimming is harder than walking.

- Safety from crime and crashes: How much crime is in the neighborhood? How many traffic accidents are there? Are streets well-lit?
- Pedestrian-friendly community design: Are buildings close to the sidewalk with parking in back? Are destinations clustered together?
- Weather: In some places it's just too hot or cold to walk regularly.




