Make sure the costume's length doesn't drag on the ground (no one wants to trip and fall!). Wear makeup and hats. Avoid masks that obscure your vision.

Before eating the candy, inspect it at home! Candy showing signs of tampering, discoloration, pinholes, tears in wrappers or anything else that looks suspicious, need to be dumped! **Trick-or-Treaters:** Eat something before heading out to avoid the temptation to nibble on treats that haven't been checked. Politely say "no" to anything that isn't commercially wrapped.

CAPS Report

Beat #1723 September 21st, 2011

Specific West Walker Issues Discussed at September 21, 2011 CAPS Meeting for Beat #1723:

The corner of Monticello and Belle Plaine and the immediate surrounding area continue to be an issue with respect to reported criminal activity. At the CAPS Meeting, among other things, there were reports of multiple instances of shots fired, suspected drug dealing and gang activity. The police are monitoring the situation. If you see any of this activity, call 911 immediately so that police may respond to an incident in progress. If you do not want to provide your name, state that you wish to remain anonymous when you begin speaking to the 911 operator.

As reported in the September, 2011 WW Wire, on Thursday, August 25th, a neighbor reported that over 30 vehicles had tires slashed on and around the 3800 block of Cullom. The CAPS office indicated that the police had only three calls for service regarding the incident. The calls for service did not reflect the extent of the problem. If you have any information relating to the incidents or if your vehicle's tires were slashed and you have not reported it to the police, please contact 311 to make a report.

In addition to auto thefts and thefts from autos, burglaries are on the rise. Please take steps to lock your doors and secure your property.

CAPS meetings for our beat are currently held monthly at the 17th District Police Station, 4650 N. Pulaski, in the Community Room. Meetings begin at 7 p.m. on the third Wednesday of the month and typically last one hour. The next regularly scheduled meeting for Beat 1723 is Wednesday, October 19, 2011.

As always, call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood and provide a detailed physical description of the individuals involved in any incident, including clothing, shoes and vehicle descriptions. For incidents which are no longer in progress, remember that rather than calling 911, you may call 311 to have a police officer complete a report for incidents such as theft, criminal damage to property, lost property and other non-emergency situations. Even if a neighbor has already reported the incident or activity, other neighbors should make separate calls. The police often look at the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers and resources with respect to a particular situation or incident.

News from the Irving Park Community Food Pantry

August was a record-breaking month at the Pantry. In addition to handing out over 400 school-supply packets to clients with school-age children, the Pantry served 1,917 people in 720 households, which includes 84 new households with 221 people. As a result of the economy, donations are down and the need for food has never been greater. Thanks to everyone who helped ensure we continue our record of never turning away a client because we ran out of food!

Party with the Pantry October 15th!

Enjoy food, drink, music, games and fun with your neighbors on **Saturday, October 15th at the Irving Park Food Pantry's Harvest Benefit!** The event will be held from 5 to 9 p.m. at the Irving Park Lutheran Church gymnasium at 4057 N. Harding Ave. (not the church itself).

The benefit, which is for adults only, will include a harvest dinner, cash bar, DJ music, games and a raffle. Tickets are \$20 per person, which provides food, one drink (soda, beer or wine) and one raffle ticket. Tickets are \$10 for seniors 65 years and older. Tickets are available at the door or at the Pantry's website (www. irvingparkfoodpantry.org).

Proceeds from the event will directly benefit the Pantry and be used for operational expenses and to purchase food from the Greater Chicago Food Depository. That food-which is purchased at 7¢/pound from the depository-along with all donations, are used to make up three days' worth of emergency food that clients are eligible to receive once per month from the Pantry.

Seanachai Theatre's The Shadow of A Gunman

This is a haunting play. The setting is a 1920s Dublin tenement. In this period, life was nearly intolerable. The military conflict with the British army totally poisoned every day life, and the world seemed to have gone mad.

Privacy was virtually non-existent for the lower classes in particular, and Sean O'Casey's play zeroes in on that particular segment of society with heartbreaking clarity by showing us a slice of life for a few people within one building within one day. We watch this group of people struggle to maintain a sense of "normalcy" in abnormal times. We see their poignant search for order in a chaotic world and their hope that the "gunman" can solve their problems. True to the literary gift of the Irish, O'Casey breathes humor into these characters' desperate interactions. That touch of gentleness is what keeps the audience fascinated on the journey to the day's end.

I think that most people will recognize these characters from their own lives, or at least an aspect of them. I personally have a great memory of my grandmother that I used as a basis for my character, Mrs. Henderson. It truly has been a joy to work on this show, and our ensemble has been gratified to learn that The Shadow of A Gunman has just been nominated for a Joseph Jefferson award (Chicago's equivalent of the Tony award).
