As West Walker President, I am writing this from what will soon be the 45th Ward (Arena). Some of your West Walker neighbors will stay in the 39th Ward (Laurino), and others will be in the 35th Ward (Colon). Where will you be?

The good news is you don't have to be a detective to figure it out. Just visit the West Walker website. There you will find a link to a map which displays the new ward boundaries. Also, you don't have to be in too much of a rush to find your spot in the new wards, as your current alderman will remain your alderman, until the next Aldermanic elections in 2015.

Until then we will be reaching out to all three Aldermen to ensure West Walker is ready to work with all of our Ward Aldermen when the time comes for our official trifurcation. Until then, we will start to put additional contact information on the website and in the Wire, so you'll always know who to call.

March Meeting Update

Don't forget to mark your calendar for the March meeting. It will be held on **March 27,** not March 20, to avoid conflicting with the General Election. We are making the change as the Latvian Center serves as the polling place for two precincts on Election Day.

The March meeting will be used to discuss and provide information regarding the implementation of effective on-line block groups and phone trees. Although often used to increase police response to crime, these tools can also be used to exchange information, request city services and highlight concerns that exist in small sectors of West Walker. 

Beat #1723, February 15, 2012

Specific West Walker Issues Discussed:

The corner of Monticello and Belle Plaine and the immediate surrounding area continue to be an issue with respect to reported criminal activity. Among other things, there have been reports of multiple instances of shots fired, suspected drug dealing and gang activity. The police continue to monitor the situation.

The man who has been asking for money and accosting people, especially women and children, on the corner of Irving Park and Central Park, was arrested in early February, 2012 on a warrant for failure to appear in court and is currently being held without bail in Cook County.

"Keepin' It Real" Burglary Workshop In an effort to encourage burglary prevention, the 17th District Police is calling upon "experts" for their "Keepin It Real" Burglary Workshop. At this special CAPS event, individuals

who have actually been caught for burglary talk about how and why they burglarize - from slipping past security systems to what kind of items they have taken. The seminar features insights from "experts," people who have been arrested for burglaries. They will share insights on how and why they burglarize—from slipping past security

systems to what kinds of items are attractive to burglars.


Seanachai Theatre's Ceili

March is Poison Prevention **Month for Fido Too!**

Growing up with my best friend, a scrappy mutt named Buddy, brings back such phenomenal memories for me. As a young dog owner, I remember getting a regular poison warning from the adults...." Do not give the dog Chocolate or he will get very sick." Even as a child, I became very aware of the many hazards that my puppy could get into, and was very protective of Buddy.

March is when America celebrates Poison Prevention Month, a reminder of how to keep our human and pet family members safe, and what to do in case of this type of emergency. Most pet owners have no idea just how many things are toxic for a dog to ingest. Some-but not all-items that can cause serious harm to your pet: Alcoholic beverages, apple seeds, various fruit pits, any candy or gum containing xylitol, chocolate, coffee, grapes, various nuts, mushrooms, onions, onion powder, raisins, salt in large quantities, tea, and various plant leaves. In some cases, these can be potentially fatal.

If your dog has ingested any of these items, symptoms may include (but not limited to) vomiting, diarrhea, lethargy, hyperactivity, anxiousness, seizures, difficulty breathing, lack of appetite, abdominal pain and more. If you suspect that your dog has ingested any of the above items, immediately call your vet or the ASPCA Poison Control Center at 1-888-426-4435. Act fast! The longer the poison remains in your dog's system without treatment, the more detrimental it is to your dog.

As part of Poison Prevention Month, make sure that these types of items are safely stored out of reach from your pets and young family members. Make sure to keep the poison control number posted in your home where everyone can see it and is aware what to do in case of a poison emergency. A little prevention can protect your family.




