## WWCA General Meeting Minutes

March 27th, 2012

Officers Present: Mike Webber, Davor Engel.

Current bank balance was reported by Mike Webber to be approximately \$3,800.00.

Davor Engel reported on his attendance at the recent Save Portage Theater meeting, which attracted more than 1000 attendees. The Chicago Tabernacle, an Albany Park

religious organization, has proposed to purchase the theater and convert it for church use. This would include removal of the marquee and substantial alteration of the interior. The conversion of the theater is opposed Alderman Arena; however, the church has applied to

the zoning board for the necessary zoning changes, which would be required prior to the church's purchase of the property. More information is available at www.portagepark.org and a facebook page has been established at www.facebook.com/SavePortageTheater.

Mike Webber reported on methods to create neighborhood watch and phone tree groups to help neighbors report concerns ranging from litter to crime.

Materials supplied by the Seventh District were distributed to meeting attendees. In addition, the

WWCA is investigating several new hyperlocal social networking platforms as possible recommendations to modernize traditional neighborhood watch and phone tree systems.

These social networks could be used for the entire West Walker area or sized down to specific blocks to suit the needs of a given block. More information regarding these

networks will be provided in the future.

As a reminder, for certain complaints (such as loud noise, panhandlers and aggressive people), the police often need to see an activity to make an arrest or take other action. In such cases, reporting the activity at a CAPS meeting or making a community concern report through ClearPath is not as helpful in resolving the issue as calling 911. So, in addition to registering such a complaint at a CAPS meeting or through a community concern report, a person seeing and wishing to report such activity should call 911 at the time the activity is occurring, so the police can respond, see the activity and take appropriate action.

CAPS meetings for our beat are currently held monthly at the 17th District Police Station, 4650 N. Pulaski, in the Community Room. Meetings begin at 7:00 p.m. on the third Wednesday of the month and typically last one hour. The next regularly scheduled meeting for Beat 1723 is Wednesday, April 18, 2012.

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## 39th Ward Report



The Department of Water Management will install a new sewer main in Monticello, from Berteau Avenue to Belle Plaine Avenue, and in Belle Plaine, from Monticello to Elston, to replace the existing 106 year old pipes. Installation of the new sewer will begin shortly, with completion anticipated for May

2012, depending on weather.

During the last part of construction (approximately early May), Elston Avenue will be closed to "through traffic" between Hamlin and Ridgeway. Traffic will be detoured along Pulaski and Irving Park. "Local Traffic Only" will be allowed between Pulaski and Hamlin, and Irving Park and Ridgeway. Restoration of the damaged streets and parkways will follow this project. The Department of Water Management will soon be contacting residents who will be immediately affected by the construction. This is a major construction project that will no doubt cause some disruption, but it will benefit the community with improved drainage and a reduced risk of flooding.

With milder weather here, the Department of Streets and Sanitation has begun their Street Sweeping program. Street sweeping occurs between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. on weekdays. Watch for the brightly colored "No Parking" signs posted on light poles and parkway trees. Failure to comply with parking restrictions for street sweeping will result in a costly ticket.

The Chicago Park District has a variety of programs for children and adults. Online registration for Summer 2012 programs begins on Monday, April 9th, and walkin registration begins on Saturday, April 14th. Please contact Independence Park (3945 N.
