39th Ward Report



SINCE MY LAST LETTER to the Wire, some rather significant changes have occurred. The city is in the process of transitioning to a grid system of garbage pick-up. West Walker residents now have their garbage picked-up on Wednesdays.

Construction season is in full swing. The 39th Ward's biggest construction project is the Foster Avenue sewer project, which is closing parts of Foster from Pulaski to Kimball. While not located in the West Walker area, closure of a major street likely affects all 39th Ward residents.

I-GO, Chicago's only local, non-profit car-sharing company recently opened a new location in the West Walker area at 4255 N. Pulaski (next to Heavenly Touch Car Wash). I-GO members can reserve a car by the hour or day. Chicago residents recently received their new voter registration cards. Some West Walker residents will remain in the 39th Ward. Others will be located in the 35th or 45th Wards. The first question people ask is, "When will this be in effect?" Easy question, difficult answer. It's a bit unclear precisely when the new boundaries take effect. Three Brothers Garden Offers Classes

To conclude its annual lecture series, Three Brothers Garden will host two classes in September. On September 8th at 11:00 a.m., Chef Ed Gardner will do a cooking demonstration titled, "I've got all these tomatoes -- now what?" Chef Gardner, an Instructor at Le Cordon Bleu Chicago, will share ideas and recipes for how to maximize the bounty of your garden or local farmer's market.

Master Gardener Dolly Foster will talk about composting on September 22 at 10:00 a.m. Dolly will explain the basics, the benefits, and the composting "dos" and "don'ts." The shed was built in December and January as Nils' Eagle Scout project, and last month Garden Coordinator Kurt Schroeter added cedar siding. Paul Clausen and Gordon Johnson provided valuable construction expertise. Next: Our solar lighting project, also part of the grant award.



Thanks to 40th District State Representative Deb Mell, who held a food drive in July for the Pantry that collected a barrel full of food and several boxes of personal-care items. "While food drives are popular during the holiday season, food is needed throughout the year," she pointed out in her letter to constituents. We appreciate the support from her and all of the people who donated!

The Pantry continues to need personal-care items. Most in demand are shampoo (not conditioner), shower gel, shaving razors and cream/gel, body lotion, soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes, toilet paper and baby diapers (especially size #4).

All summer, the Three Brothers Garden is supplying the Pantry with weekly deliveries of organic, fresh produce, with the goal of providing 1,000 pounds this summer. Thanks to Liz Mills and all the volunteers who tend the garden and harvest the fruits of their labor.

Thanks also to the Mount Olive Church congregation (3850 N. Tripp) for their generous Spring Quarter donation! Their regular support is greatly appreciated!

Our SNAP (food stamps) Outreach program received a new laptop and designated printer from the Greater Chicago Food Depository in August. The money was provided through a Walmart Foundation grant designed to increase participation in the SNAP program. The

Help us ensure our neighbors' children get the school year off to a great start!
