purchase a piece for your private collection at our Opening Gallery Reception on Friday, February 22 from 7:00–9:00 p.m. This event is free and open to the public.

On Saturday, February 23rd at 7:00 p.m., there will be a staged reading of "On Trial: Intelligent Design and Evolution." This work is based on the first U.S. Federal Court test of a public school policy that required the teaching of intelligent design. (2005 Supreme Court case Kitzmiller vs. Dover Area School District). The reading will highlight selected portions of testimony, the judge's final decision interspersed with everyday Americans' responses. The script was adapted from the trial transcripts by Tim Broderick with assistance from Christina Calvit and directed by Karen Hoyer.

In addition to the Opening Reception, the gallery artwork can be viewed on Saturday, February 23 from

Looking down the road, I wanted to remind everyone that our next two meetings are on March 19, 2013 and April 16, 2013. Our program in March should be of interest to all, as it deals with ways to make your home more efficient and will provide information on how to obtain rebates for making those improvements. The meeting will feature a representative from Energy Impact Illinois, which is a residential energy efficiency program focused on helping homeowners make the lowest cost, most effective energy efficiency upgrades to their homes. They are funded by federal stimulus dollars as well as local utilities, and provide subsidized energy efficiency assessments as well as rebates to homeowners who participate in the program, which can cover 70% of the cost of these upgrades. The inventory of homes for sale is low, a fact noted by the Chicago Tribune on Jan. 23, 2013 when it stated that "(c)ompared to a year ago, inventory has plunged. For instance, in Chicago, there were 14,183 homes for sale in December 2011. Last month, there were 8,036 listed properties, or 43.3 percent less. As a result, the average number of days it took to sell a Chicago home fell almost 19 percent year-over-year, to 77 days last month."

The Irving Park Fine Arts Committee will present "The Fabulous Fable Factory," a children's musical based on Aesop's fables, on March 9th at 10:00 a.m. "The Fabulous Fable Factory" tells the story of 12-year-old Monroe who wanders into an abandoned factory and accidentally trips a lever activating a living factory of fable creators. News From Irving Park Community Food Pantry

Thanks to Pantry Donators for Holiday Help!

The Irving Park Community Food Pantry would like to thank everyone in our neighborhood who contributed to the Pantry's holiday distribution program in December. This special program allowed our clients to prepare a nutritious holiday meal for their household and help make their holiday season a little more joyful.

Held on December 19th, the program provided the makings of a holiday meal to 1,350 people in 407 households. Nearly 200 of those households also received pet food and could select from other accessories for their pets, including collars and leashes, food bowls and Frisbees at the Pantry's Pet Food Corner.

Offering those groceries, in addition to our regular December distribution, required considerable extra effort from many people and organizations. They contributed money as well as time to run food drives, pick up food from supermarkets, set up food stations, pack groceries and direct clients that day.

Thanks especially to everyone who responded to our Holiday mailing. We appreciate your monetary donations, as we can buy food from the Greater Chicago Food Depository at 8¢ per pound. That means the funds you spare for us go a long way toward buying all kinds of food to supplement food donations.

Thirty-five volunteers and community residents helped set up food stations on Tuesday night, and 63 people worked on the pantry floor and in the special Toy Room during the distribution. Thanks to **Dale Tippet, Jr.** for

providing music while clients waited in the Irving Park United Methodist Church sanctuary. The sanctuary was standing-room only early that morning, and we appreciate Pastor Katherine Thomas Paisley for allowing us to use the facility to provide comfort and warmth for our clients.

The corner of the

sanctuary also provided Santa and his various elves with a place to greet children and to hand out small stuffed toys as they waited. Thanks to **Cody Cousino**, on break from Ohio State University, for taking on the role of Santa.

Included in the distribution, as we always have, was a station for ineligible clients. To qualify to receive the additional holiday groceries, clients had to have visited the Pantry at least three times during the calendar year prior to October. But the Pantry also has a policy of never turning away anyone who needs food for their family. Each week, we offer an emergency supply of food to those who don't qualify for our regular distribution (because they are out of the ZIP codes we serve), and the holiday distribution was no different.

This year, that group comprised about 135 people (65 households), including 12 new households (52 people) in our area. Those who were ineligible to receive the full holiday package for their household received a smaller amount of food: Enough frozen meat (chicken, sausage, etc.) for a serving for each in the household (courtesy of Jewel Foods), two cans of vegetables, one loaf of bread, a can each of fruit and soup, two onions, two carrots, six eggs, a carton of yogurt per person, milk (for children) and a dessert.

These supplies were made possible by the donations of money and food we receive from our contributors, and we thank everyone in the community for helping. Thanks to **Judy Powell** and **Arlene Simko** for operating this station, which often requires working with the visitors and new clients to explain what they have to do and what they're getting.

Thank you to the Miriam Circle (Irving Park Lutheran Church), who donated \$256 from their Annual Bake Sale and Boutique proceeds. We also thank Sylvia Aldrete

and the employees at AT&T, who brought in a donation of \$1,000 to the Pantry in January. Thank you the Walmart Foundation, which has renewed its grant with the GCFD, from which the Pantry will receive funds.

Thanks also to **Barbara Ries Murphy**,
who worked with **Ted's Place** (4425

N. Central), to hold a

food drive for the Pantry, promoting it on her Facebook page. The drive culminated in a party January 18th, where donations of canned food, hygiene products and money were collected. In all, she collected 78 boxes of food, three boxes of personal-care items and \$1400! We appreciate her efforts and everyone who contributed time and donations on our behalf!

Our Pet Food Corner seeks volunteers to help pick up donated pet food and supplies at the Community Animal Rescue Effort (C.A.R.E.) headquarters at 2310 Oakton Street in Evanston each Monday or Tuesday to deliver to the Pantry on Wednesday morning. A van or a truck would be ideal. Please contact Lee Stein at volunteer@irvingparkfoodpantry.org

The Pantry continues to operate a SNAP web-application assistance program, which helps about 15 to 20 households each month apply for SNAP benefits from the Pantry. Since March, when the program was launched, nearly 200 households with 320 people have applied for SNAP benefits through the Pantry.

In December, the Pantry served 2,638 people in 844 households with both distributions, including 40 new households with 116 people. About half of the households received pet food. That brought our totals for 2012 to 7,821 visits to provide food for 22,207 people, including 615 new households with 1,750 people during the year.


