Tuition-based Afterschool Program

The Irving Park YMCA After School Enrichment Program runs Monday through Friday from 3:30 until 6 p.m. and is located at the Kedvale Campus, 3815 N. Kedvale.

The Irving Park YMCA After School Enrichment Program is for children ages 5-14 that need a safe and nurturing environment to learn, play and make friends after school. The program focuses on educational enrichment and physical activity. Programming includes homework help, arts and crafts, science and technology, character development, physical activity, and martial arts. Registration is monthly and part time can be accommodated (3 days a week minimum). The cost of the program is \$290 per month for 5 days and \$174 a month for 3 days a week. 39th Ward Report



DO YOU DRIVE on Foster Avenue? Over the years, I've received many requests from the community to address traffic safety and speeding issues along Foster Avenue near Gompers Park. We've tried a number of enforcement methods, including radar guns and sting operations, with some levels of success. But

the problem continues. Since Gompers is located in a Children's Safety Zone, and since data backs up our concerns, the city recently installed automated speed enforcement cameras on Foster and Pulaski. Violations recorded in the first 30 days of a camera's installation will receive a warning notice. The easiest way to avoid a ticket is to pay attention to and follow the posted speed limits.

In addition to the speed cameras, Foster Avenue is part of a large construction project. The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) is beginning a resurfacing project on Foster from Harlem to Ashland Avenues. Construction began on August 14, starting at Harlem and Foster Avenues. We will keep you updated on the progress as they make their way toward the 39th Ward.

The city is resuming enforcement of the residential truck ordinance. Typically, commercial and business trucks cannot park on residential streets, unless they are there specifically to provide a service to a resident. However, if you have a truck weighing 8,000 pounds or less, which you use as your personal (not business) vehicle, you may obtain a Residential Truck Permit from my office. This permit will allow you to park the truck in front of your home. There is no charge for the permit.

In development news, you've probably noticed the vacant lot at the northeast corner of Montrose and Pulaski. The former King of Tile location was sold and 7-11 is building a new store at this location. They are currently in the permitting phase and hope to start construction soon. First Chicago Bank and Trust (the former Labe Bank) is moving forward with their plans to build a new bank on their vacant site at 4343 N. Elston. The Zoning Board of Appeals recently approved their plans for a drive-thru and the city is reviewing their construction plans.

Ponations Boost Food Pantry We are very grateful to the congregation of Gethsemane Romanian Pentecostal Church (3838 N. Elston) who has donated \$15,000 to the Pantry. This amount represented a portion of proceeds they received from the sale of their church building.

The Catholic Archdiocese of Chicago has renewed our grant from Operation Rice Bowl for \$1,500, which will be used to underwrite expenses associated with our Nutrition classes, run by Alicia Theofanis of the University of Illinois Extension Program. 
