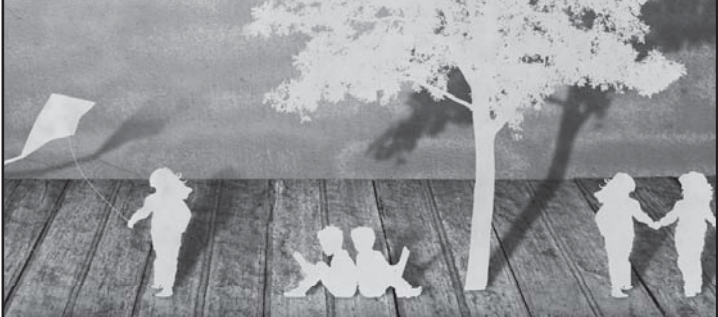

News from Irving Park Community Food Pantry

Pantry Holiday Distribution December 18th

The Irving Park Community Food Pantry is still collecting food, toy and monetary donations for the annual Holiday Celebration for our clients, which will be held on December 18th. At this event each year, we provide our clients with the makings of a holiday dinner and allow those with children to select a gift for each of them. To provide these special provisions, we are especially in need of juice, stuffing, cranberry sauce, canned yams and vegetables, instant potatoes, cake mixes, Jell-O and pumpkin-pie filling.

We typically need toys for about 400 children (ages infant to 12). For some, it will be the only gift they receive. Your donations ensure clients' children can talk about their special gift with their friends who receive so much more. This year, we also are hoping to collect enough books to allow each teen-aged child to also have a book to read.

Unwrapped new toys, books and food donations can be brought to the Pantry at the Irving Park United Methodist Church (3801 N. Keeler) from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Tuesday through Thursday, Sunday morning, and other times the church is running programs. Donations can be left at the base of the stairs inside the Grace Street entrance. Please call the church first at 773-283-6262, to make sure that someone will be there to let you in the building. Final deadline for donations is December 15th. To help with the toy distribution, contact Vicci Rodgers at viccirodgers@gmail.com or 773-316-9754.

After working out details with the Greater Chicago Food Depository to ensure deliveries could be made smoothly on Wednesday mornings, the Pantry has enrolled in GCFD's Food Rescue program, in which they deliver perishable food to us early Wednesday mornings. The deliveries consist of frozen meat, produce, pastries and other foods that have to go out immediately that week. The program has worked well since it began in November, allowing us to greatly enhance our weekly offerings. We also have had enough available to pass some along to the pantry at St. John's Lutheran Church, the dinner program at St. Viator and Hands to Help Ministries at St. John's Episcopal Church. Thanks to Operations Manager Jim Byrne and to all of the volunteers who help unload and distribute the food so quickly Wednesday mornings!

A banner has been installed on the grass in front of our home at the Irving Park United Methodist Church, funded by a portion of a Kraft Feeding Possibilities grant. It includes pantry details and has room for a short message. Currently, we intend to promote our night hours on the second Tuesday of the month. The Pantry next will be open to clients from 6 to 8 p.m. on Tuesday, December 10th.

The Pantry's October coat distribution helped a large number of clients receive warm coats for the coming winter. A big swell of donations in the last week helped expand our inventory, allowing us to stay open one more week in November to give more clients a chance to receive a warm coat. In all, we gave out 260 coats, and they were very well received.

Special thanks to the parents and students at Disney II Elementary Magnet School for organizing a coat drive and participating in the distribution. Thanks to Sarah Marton for coordinating the Disney program and to her, husband Mike and Renee Linnemeyer for helping clients during operating hours.

St. Viator's school mission is to instill a life-long love of learning, a respect for all people, and a commitment to Catholic social justice and peace. St. Viator understands the importance of giving back to our community and neighbors in need at the holidays and throughout the year.

Both school and parish families participated in the Baby Bottle Campaign, filling empty baby bottles with spare change to help the Women's Center of Chicago assist women in crisis pregnancies and their babies.

To celebrate Thanksgiving, the Student Council sponsored a food drive benefiting Irving Park Community Food Pantry and St. Viator's parish. Volunteers prepared complete Thanksgiving dinner food baskets for the less fortunate, while non-perishable food items were restocked by the food drive.

All students took time to reflect and give thanks for the many blessings in their lives. In tradition of the first Thanksgiving, the younger grades gathered together to enjoy a Thanksgiving Feast of their own. The 3rd - 8th graders joined students from Schurz High School in a day of service. The national organization, Build-On, whose mission is "to break the cycle of poverty, illiteracy and low expectations through service and education" coordinated the day of service. Working with the International Baccalaureate students from Schurz High School, the organization planned hands-on activities for our students benefiting those in need in the Chicago community. Activities included decorating bags used for Thanksgiving dinners for elders and making treats for Thanksgiving dinners, as well as fleece blankets, and holiday cards. St. Viator students prepared for this day by collecting health and hygiene items as well as fleece to use for the projects. The day also included ice breakers and reflection.

Mrs. Johnson, St. Viator's 6th grade teacher, said, "This was an opportunity for our students to share their time, talent, and treasure with others. We are grateful to Build-On and Schurz High School for including us in this worthwhile learning experience and to our St. Viator families for supporting the project."

CICS-IRVING PARK SCHOOL

Top ISAT Achievement For the third consecutive year, Chicago International Charter School's (CICS) Irving Park Campus received the highest overall ISAT scores among the city's 54 elementary charter schools.

Mathletes! CICS-IP students in grades 6 thru 8 have joined the Chicago Junior Math League through CPS! High performing math students are recommended by their teachers to participate in this rigorous math-based after school program. They compete in three citywide math competitions at UIC. We have 30 students participating under coaches Ms. Green and Ms. Gierthy.

"Power Hour" of Literacy This year, students have one "power hour" four days a week for personalized reading instruction. During this time, students are grouped by their instructional strengths to maximize their learning. Then, twice a month, our teachers meet to discuss how to better support the students' learning and to review personalized learning plans.

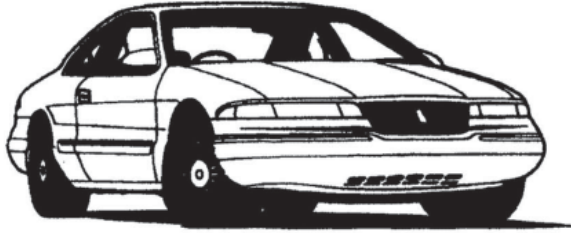
