People's Gas Neighborhood Utility Work Update

WWCA has been in touch with Alderman Arena's office to get a better understanding of the ongoing People's Gas work at Irving & Elston Avenues. While the current work has been completed it looks as though we have more traffic delays in store for us. A reply from Andi VanderKolk has relayed the following:

"Peoples Gas just finished working in the intersection of Irving Park and Elston and retired our entire old main in this specific area. The work that is to come is the new LP/MP. (Low pressure to Medium Pressure Conversion) The scope will be as follows.

In Irving Park: From Lawndale to Elston – Main installation in parkways/sidewalks and approximately 6-7 services transferred. Main retirement in street.

In Elston: From Irving Park to St Louis – Main Installation in parkways/sidewalks and approximately 20 services transferred. Main retirement in street.

In Central Park: From Elston to Addison – Main Installation in parkways and approximately 110 services transferred. Main retirement in street.

In St. Louis: From Elston to Addison – Main Installation in parkways and approximately 110 services transferred. Main retirement in street.

This work is still in design and should be in OUC by mid to end of February. We are anticipating starting by May 1st."

No word as to estimated completion date.

Pantry's Holiday Program Helps 1,244

The Irving Park Community Food Pantry's December 18th Holiday distribution provided the makings for a holiday meal to 1,244 of our neighbors in 376 households. In addition, 246 children between the ages of 0 and 12 received a toy, two stocking stuffers and mittens, scarves and caps.

Even though we did not receive a donation from Toys for Tots as we often have in the past, we had enough contributions from our own donators to have some toys left over, which were passed along to several local organizations. These groups included Carlson Community Services' MAP program, the Hispanic Ministry of the Irving Park United Methodist Church, and the City of Chicago's Women, Infants & Children program.

Thank you to Barb Cohn and Vicci Rodgers Keutzer for leading a very successful toy collection and distribution. Thanks also to Jim Byrne, Nick Calderone, Rick Lietl, Pat Eisenhart, Leslie Washington, Craig O'Connor and many others for their help in collecting and distributing the groceries and toys.

Regional Spelling Bee




