



## News from Irving Park Community Food Pantry

### Be a Bunny for the Irving Park Food Pantry

The Irving Park Community Food Pantry again will be distributing Easter bags to its clients for their children on four Wednesdays starting March 26th (Easter is April 20th). We are collecting goodies (candy, snacks, small toys, etc.) for children in the age categories of under 2, 2 to 5, and 6 to 8 years old.

Please drop off any donations at the Irving Park United Methodist Church (corner of Grace and Keeler - Grace Street entrance). Financial donations are extremely helpful and are used to purchase necessary supplies, especially to fill in depleted items late in the month. This can be done by mail or through PayPal at the Pantry's website (www.irvingparkfoodpantry.org). Questions can be sent to Vicci Rodgers at viccirodgers@gmail.com.

Thanks to the congregations at Irving Park United Methodist Church and Irving Park Lutheran Church for their continued support of this tradition through donations and time to create the baskets for children.

The Chicago Department of Family and Support Services has announced it will continue to provide the Pantry with food credits through its 2014 pilot program. As in 2013, the Pantry will receive a food credit of \$700 per month for the remainder of the year. At an average cost of 4 cents per pound this will buy a lot of food and will certainly help with our food budget!

A great big thank you to second-grade teachers Katie Rollings and Katie Fielden and their classes at Disney II Elementary Magnet School for making a huge donation to the Pantry. To help understand how businesses work, they held a Crafts & Services Fair for two afternoons in December.

They researched and surveyed for product ideas and then sold handmade scarves in school colors (yellow and blue) as well as bracelets, necklaces and school pennants. They also took photos of people in costumes, performed massages and offered other services. The two-day total donated to the Pantry (after deducting expenses) was more than \$1,000! We appreciate the students voting for the Pantry to receive their donation and to everyone at Disney who made it possible.


Thank you to the six students and Principal Mary Perillo from Park View Lutheran School for braving the frigid temperatures to come work at the Pantry in January. They

## St. Viator School


