



- 2. John K. Riordan, Director of Economic Development and Business Affairs for Alderman Margaret Laurino, reported on upcoming streetscape upgrades on Pulaski Avenue, 39th Ward Home Improvement Fair and responded to neighbors questions regarding Ward issues.
- 3. Mike Webber reported that the WWCA operating balance was \$3,815.73.
- 3. Jack Prikos of Farmers Market Garden Center spoke on a number of topics including the history of Farmers Market and the "sustainable" gardening projects. Native varieties of perennials, trees and shrubs were discussed. In addition, the "impatiens downy mildew" affecting the Chicago land area was discussed. This highly destructive disease is spreading rampantly through the City, and has caused many plant sellers to stop selling impatiens. Alternant species are available. Visit your local garden center to learn more.

Recycling Reminder

Recycling crews have noticed a pattern in the types of items that are inappropriately placed in the blue recycling carts. Here is a list of common recycling contaminates that should not be in the Blue Cart: plastic bags, shredded paper, styrofoam (also, known as #6 plastics), unnumbered plastics, yard waste, electronics, and household chemicals. 39th Ward Report



IF YOU WANT TO LEARN about birds and their habitats while enjoying a walk through the woods at the North Park Village Nature Center, join the Chicago Audubon Society for Spring Birds Walks with an expert leader who can answer all questions regarding birds. The Spring Birds Walks are conducted every Saturday

during May from 8:00 a.m. until 10:00 a.m. These events are free and everyone is welcome. If you have questions, please call the Chicago Audubon Society at 773-539-6793.

The long awaited Pulaski Road Streetscape, from Montrose to Wilson, will be underway in May. The design includes new sidewalks with decorative permeable pavers, new street poles with neighborhood identifier banners, thermoplastic intersection design at Montrose and Pulaski, benches, planters, and a public plaza adjacent to Thai Town.

The City Clerk's Office will be mailing city sticker renewal forms in May. This marks the first year the City Clerk's Office will be offering year-round city stickers and staggering the expiration date. Your new city sticker renewal month will be

set six months from the expiration of your state license plate registration. For example, if your state license plate expires in May, your new city sticker will expire in November. During this transition period, residents will have the option to purchase a prorated city sticker (valid between 1 and 11 months) or an extended vehicle sticker (valid between 13 and 23 months). If you are a senior 65+, you will not be affected by the change to year-round sales and will remain on a June-to-June renewal schedule. More information about the year-round stickers can be found in your renewal notice or on the City Clerk's website at www.ChiCityClerk.com. On Monday, June 16, from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m., the City Clerk's Office will be in my 39th Ward Public Service Office (4404 W. Lawrence) to sell City Vehicle and Residential Zone Parking Stickers and to answer questions.

Hunger Walk Set For June 21st

The Irving Park Community Food Pantry is gearing up for the 29th annual Hunger Walk, to be held June 21st at Soldier Field. The walk, sponsored by the Greater Chicago Food Depository, consists of a 5-k (3.1-mile) walk along the lakefront aimed at raising awareness about hunger in our communities. Pantries and other organizations come together to create a large crowd with activities and music during the day.

The Walk is the Pantry's biggest fund-raising event of the year, so please save the date and join us. Registration opens at 7 a.m., and the walk steps off at 8:30 a.m. You don't need to actually walk, just show up at the event (kids count too) and you get counted toward our total to boost our contribution from GCFD!

Co-owners Mike Barrett and Mike McNichols of Liberty Tax Service stopped at the Pantry in April to deliver the proceeds from their promotion in March, in which clients received discounted tax preparation in exchange for a donation to the Pantry. The two delivered a check for

The Pantry will be open from 6 to 8 p.m. on May 13th. Our evening hours are picking up new clients for us and making us busier each month. In April, we served 121 people in 41 households, which included four new households this month.


