West Walker Real Estate Home Prices Are Up!

The Spring real estate market is here and there's good news for our neighborhood! Single family home sale prices in the last year are up 32% versus the prior year. And multi-family home sale prices are up 22%! Here is our current market recap for the last 12 months.

Single family homes in West Walker

- Highest sale price was \$755,000 for a new construction home.
- 32 homes sold at an average sale price of \$412,900. A year before that the average sale price was \$314,200. That's a 32% increase in the last year!





Three Brothers Garden Introduces "Project Homegrown" At Irving Park Food Pantry



Three Brothers Garden has launched a series of hands-on classes to help clients of the Irving Park Food Pantry learn to grow vegetables at home. Called "Project Homegrown," the initiative

builds on the national trend of growing vegetables at home and links it with Food Pantry clients' stated desire for more fresh fruits and vegetables. Dorene Jordan, a registered nurse, master gardener and Three Brothers Garden volunteer is spearheading the project.

Project Homegrown consists of a series of hands-on classes where clients learn how to make a rot pot, plant seeds, transplant seedlings to a larger container and care for their plants through the summer season. At the season end, classes will focus on harvesting and using what's been grown in recipes. Up to 50 clients will participate in the program.

"With a little sun, soil and seeds, you'd be amazed at how easy it is to grow vegetables," Dorene said. "We want to share the knowledge we've gained at Three Brothers Garden to inspire clients at the food pantry to grow their own vegetables, starting small with basil, tomatoes and cilantro grown in containers."

A grant from the CHIditarod Foundation is funding the purchase of needed supplies. Food pantry clients need only find a place at their home that receives sufficient sunlight. The CHIditarod Foundation seeks to alleviate hunger and solve the root causes of hunger through creativity, engagement and direct action. Since 2009. Three Brothers Garden has grown nearly 5,000 lbs. of fresh vegetables for the Irving Park Food Pantry. Three Brothers Garden is a program run by Carlson Community Services, a 501c3 nonprofit with a mission to connect the Irving Park community with programs that enrich lives through education, culture and service. Hunger Walk Set For June 21st

The Irving Park Community Food Pantry is gearing up for the 30th annual Hunger Walk, to be held Saturday June 20th at Soldier Field. The walk, sponsored by the Greater Chicago Food

Depository, consists of a 5-k (3.1-mile) walk along the lakefront aimed at raising awareness about hunger in our communities. Pantries and other organizations come together to create a large crowd with activities and music during the day.

The Walk is the Pantry's biggest fund-raising event of the year, so please save the date and join us. Registration opens at 7 a.m., and the walk steps off at 8:30 a.m. You don't need to actually walk, just show up at the event (kids count too) and you get counted toward our total to boost our contribution from GCFD. Students can receive volunteer service hours for participating!
