No new incidents to report in the West Walker area. Status reports on the problem buildings in the 4000 block of Hamlin and 4300 block of Ridgeway weren't available.

In response to a question about why there is no police record of a report of shots fired, Sgt. Anderson explained that unless officers find evidence of shots fired, such as a bullet casing or impact holes, they do not file a report. There must be physical evidence that shots were fired in order for there to be a report made by police.

As always, call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood and provide detailed descriptions of the individuals and vehicles involved in any incident. Even if a neighbor has already reported the incident or activity, other neighbors should make separate calls. The police often look at the number of

calls for service in determining the allocation of officers and resources with respect to a particular situation or incident. CAPS meetings for our beat are currently held monthly at the 17th District Police Station, 4650 N. Pulaski, in the Community Room. Meetings begin at 7:30 p.m. on the third Wednesday of the month and typically last one hour. The next regularly scheduled meeting for Beat 1723 is Wednesday, October 21, 2015. Magic After-School Place (MAP) Opens Door on 9th Year of Serving Neighborhood Families

On September 8th, the Magic After-School Place (MAP) began its ninth year of serving Belding and Murphy School families. MAP, a program of Carlson Community Services, serves 50 children, 80% of whom come from low-income households. With tuition at \$35 per week per child, MAP provides parents a safe and nurturing place for their children to go after school while they are at work. Equally important, children receive homework help and tutoring, receive leadership training and participate in a mentoring program with high school students from Schurz and Northside College Prep. Affordable tuition would not be possible without the gym space that MAP receives rent-free from Irving Park Lutheran Church.

In June we said a fond farewell to Cara Murray, who led the program for two years. Rachel Lockhart has stepped in to take Cara's place as Director. Rachel has been with the MAP program for two years in the position of Assistant Director. Rachel has a wealth of experience in curriculum design and character development. Three additional staff members round out the program staff.

MAP strives to engage older students in 5th-7th grades with a Junior Leader and Intern Program. Junior leaders participate in planning and carrying out service projects. They also have defined responsibilities and privileges. The Internship is a paid position for a 7th grade student.

Project Home Grown is funded by a grant to Three Brothers Garden from the ChiDiterod Foundation.

We are the only food pantry in Chicago to give our clients pet food, but pet-food donations from our usual sources have dwindled recently. So we are always in need of pet food, especially cat food as well as litter and other supplies, toys, etc. Thank you to the Community Animal Rescue Effort for their partnership in this program and to all the CARE volunteers who coordinate this valuable effort.




