The police often look at the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers and resources with respect to a particular situation or incident. CAPS meetings for our beat are currently held monthly at the 17th District Police Station, 4650 N. Pulaski, in the Community Room. Meetings begin at 7:30 p.m. on the third Wednesday of the month and typically last one hour. The next regularly scheduled meeting for Beat 1723 is Wednesday, March 16, 2016. Election Information

Any Chicago voter may use any Early Voting site in the city, regardless of where the voter lives.

Ballots cast in Early Voting are final. After casting ballots in Early Voting, voters may not return to amend, change or undo a ballot for any reason. It is a felony to vote more than once -- or to attempt to vote more than once -- in the same election.

Voters don't need a reason or excuse to use Early Voting. Government-issued photo ID is not required but is helpful if there is a question about the voter's registration, address or signature.

Registration services also are available at all Early Voting sites. NOTE: Any voter who needs to register for the first time or file an address change or name change must present two forms of ID, one of which shows the voter's current address.

News From Irving Park Community Food Pantry

Be a Bunny for the Irving Park Food Pantry

The Irving Park Community Food Pantry again is distributing Easter baskets to its clients for their children on the first four Wednesdays of March (Easter is March 27th). We are collecting goodies (candy, snacks, small toys, etc.) for children in the age categories of under 2, 2 to 5, and 6 to 8 years old. We will need donations throughout the month, as we often run out before the fourth week arrives.

Please drop off any donations at the Irving Park United Methodist Church (corner of Grace and Keeler - Grace Street entrance). Financial donations are extremely helpful and are used to purchase necessary supplies, especially to fill in depleted items late in the month. This can be done by mail or through PayPal at the Pantry's website (www.irvingparkfoodpantry.org). Questions can be sent to Lee Stein at volunteer@irvingparkfoodpantry.org.

Thanks to the congregations at Irving Park United Methodist Church and Irving Park Lutheran Church for their continued support of this tradition through donations and time to create the baskets for children.

Thank you to the second-grade students at Disney II Elementary Magnet School and their teachers, Katie Fielden and Elyse D'Andrea, who donated the profits from their December crafts fair to the Pantry. The students' donation totaled \$1,314, a new record for the program, now in its third year.

Pantry Executive Director John Psiharis, Office Manager Sandra Schwarzbeck and Publicity Coordinator Craig Shutt visited the class to learn about the program, answer students' questions and accept the donation. We appreciate their efforts on our behalf and the thoughtful questions they had during our visit.

Mark your calendars now for June 25th, the date of the Annual Hunger Walk, sponsored by the Greater Chicago Food Depository. The 3.1-mile (5k) walk at Soldier Field along the lakefront raises awareness and funds to help food pantries, shelters and soup kitchens throughout Chicago. Last year, the Irving Park Food Pantry raised more than \$15,000 from the Walk, with all funds going into our food budget and GCFD account. We will be telling people more about it as the date nears.

In January, the Pantry served 1,365 people in 491 households, including 103 new clients in 44 households and 67 people in 22 families who came during our Tuesday night hours. Our volunteers also helped six households with nine people apply for SNAP benefits. Our Pet Food Corner provided pet food to 258 households for dogs, cats, birds and other small animals.
