Residents Disappointed with Independence Branch Library Plan

On Tuesday March 22, 2016 a crowd of about 200 area residents met at Disney II High School for an update on the status of the Independence Library branch, located at 3548 West Irving Park Rd. On October 30, 2015 a fire that began in a nearby dry cleaner caused smoke and water damage to the Independence Library. The library has been closed since the fire.

Elected officials in attendance were State Representative Jaime Andrade and four aldermen: Alderman Carlos Ramirez- Rosa (35th ward, the library is located in his ward), Alderman Deb Mell (33rd ward), Alderman Laurino (39th ward), and Alderman John Arena (45th ward). The following Chicago Public Library officials and affiliates were in attendance: Commissioner Brian Bannon, Assistant Commissioner Andrea Telli Neighborhood Services, Patrick Molloy, Director, Government and Public Affairs, and Stephen Stults from the Department of Fleet and Facility Management.

This is a summary of what they revealed:

CPL anticipates that a much renovated (gut rehabbed) library is expected to reopen in the same space in the first quarter of 2017. They are negotiating a 7 year lease with the current landlord. This news was not well received. Elected officials and local residents expressed their strong desire for a

brand new larger state of the art library, like the recently new Albany Park Library 3401 West Foster Ave.

Currently the Independence library is 8,900 sq. ft. State Representative Andrade proposed a 15,000-18,000 sq. ft. library. Due to this fire some of the adjacent storefronts were torn down. State Rep Andrade stated that this was an opportunity to obtain the vacant land adjacent to the current library to expand the Independence library using the insurance proceeds. Due to financial challenges Commissioner Bannon felt that a new library or expansion was unlikely. Although located in a TIF there are minimal funds in this TIF to fund a new library and currently bonds can't be issued. In the meantime residents were urged to visit other library branches. They also announced that the popular Independence Library Children's Summer Reading program would continue at Independence Park (3945 N. Springfield) this summer.

All attendees agreed though pleased that Independence Library will be reopened "this cannot be the be-all. endall" as stated in the meeting by Roberta Bole, President of Friends of Independence Library. Continued elected officials and resident support will be important in foretelling the future of the Independence Library.

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CAPS Report Beat 1722 & 1723 CAPS Meeting March 16, 2016

Present: Beat facilitator Martha Hack, CAPS Officer Maryjane Park, Officer Hamid, Beat 1722

Approximately 15 people attended the March CAPS meeting – lighter than usual. Monica Lopez, a Chicago Police Officer, gave a presentation about a non-profit she founded, I'm Not Just a Name Children's Resource Center. The Center recently established an office at 4425 W. Montrose. INJANCRC was established to raise awareness of and provide education about missing and exploited children. The Center can provide businesses and organizations with safety programs and training to help reduce the number of missing children in Illinois. The organization's web site is www.injancrc.org.

There were no updates from the February meeting. A West Walker neighbor from the 3800 block of West Berteau brought up a concern about the number of cars that speed through the stop sign at Springfield and Berteau. The officers noted her concern. She also spoke about suspicious activity in the alley in the 4100 block of Springfield/Avers and about the presence of various gang graffiti, which has since been removed. She was encouraged to report any illegal activity to 911 and make neighbors aware through the WWCA Crime Alert e-mail blasts, westwalkercrimealerts@gmail.com.

As always, call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood and provide detailed descriptions of the individuals and vehicles involved in any incident. Even if a neighbor has already reported the incident or activity, other neighbors should make separate calls. The police often look at the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers and resources with respect to a particular situation or incident. CAPS meetings for our beat are currently held monthly at the 17th District Police Station, 4650 N. Pulaski, in the Community Room. Meetings begin at 7:30 p.m. on the third Wednesday of the month and typically last one hour. The next regularly scheduled meeting for Beat 1723 is Wednesday, April 20, 2016. News From Irving Park Community Food Pantry

Pantry Herb Garden Plans Growth for 2016

The Irving Park Community Food Pantry is starting up its Herb Garden at the Irving Park United Methodist Church in the space adjacent to the Pantry entrance just off Keeler Ave. alongside the Serenity and Prayer Garden. We are seeking donations and volunteers to help build on the success it had during its introduction last year.

The garden is a collaboration with Three Brothers Garden, which operates its own garden for the Pantry, and IPUMC. The herbs that we grow, comprising basil, oregano, cilantro, thyme, parsley, mint, rosemary and sage, are harvested early Wednesday mornings and distributed to clients at distributions later that day.

Last year's garden got off to a great start, with more than 50 bags of herbs distributed each week. We are now looking for donations to increase production before expanding our crops in new ways next year. Among the items we are seeking are organic soils and herb plants. We also need volunteers to help tend the garden during the week or sponsors who will "adopt" one of the herb beds and tend it. We also are looking for tried-and-true recipes that will maximize the use of the herbs that we can use in classes for our clients.





Cats at Work Project Offers a Solution to City's Rat Problem

Although there is an ordinance for dog-owners to pick up after their dogs, the availability of food is what drives a rat's behavior, and the abundant food sources provided in a city such as Chicago most certainly whet a rat's appetite long before they turn to dog feces. Far more of an issue than dog feces are the thousands of front load trash bins found behind almost every restaurant, apartment building and business, which provide rats with a veritable smorgasbord. Additionally, rats can easily chew through the plastic lids on trash cans used by many homeowners including the city's blue bins used for Chicago's recycling program.

However, Tree House Humane Society's Cats at Work offers a proven, humane, long-term, "green," alternative solution to the city's growing rat issue. The project relocates feral or community cats to new territories where their hunting instincts and mere presence results in reduced numbers of rats. Since Cats at Work's inception in 2012, Tree House Humane Society has successfully placed more than 400 "working cats" in private backyards, barns, on condo building properties and in factories and warehouses where clients have reported an almost immediate end to their rodent problem soon after welcoming their cats.

Cats at Work also provides a humane solution for displaced, feral community cats giving them a safe and secure location where they can live out the rest of their lives. The cats are spayed or neutered, treated for parasites, vaccinated for rabies, ear-tipped and microchipped before relocation. Volunteer caretakers humanely manage the cats for the entirety of their lives with ongoing support from Tree House as mandated by Cook County's 2007 Managed Care of Feral Cats Ordinance. Common methods used to control rats such as poison and traps are ineffective, short-term solutions. Additionally, rat poison is dangerous to children, pets and the environment. Tree House's Cats at Work, an offshoot of Tree House Community Cats, provides a better solution.
