Hands to Help, The Fish Guy Support Homeless Neighbors on Chicago's Northwest Side

At the time of this writing, Hands to Help Ministries partnered with The Fish Guy and Wellfleet to auction off a private dinner for 10 to 12 guests to support homeless neighbors living on the Northwest side of Chicago. The dinner—to be awarded to the highest bidder—will feature some of the best seafood in Chicago prepared by Chef Leo Bariso.

Hands to Help is a 10-year old grassroots organization serving neighbors on the brink of homelessness and those who are experiencing homelessness. The organization was founded by a small group of neighbors and Irving Park Baptist Church, Irving Park Lutheran Church, Irving Park Methodist Church, St. John's Episcopal Church, St. Viator's Church, and Six Corner's Association. Each year the organization serves an average of 100 neighbors in the Old Irving and Portage Park community.

Bill explains his connection to Hands to Help in an email he sent to his customers:

I met Gayle Nelson at a neighborhood event and was touched to hear about the work she and volunteers do at Hands to Help. At the core of their efforts is the kind of compassion, that, if we all practiced, we would be so much better off as a City and as a Nation. It pains me to see how rough people have it trying to survive on the streets.

The assessed value determines your property taxes. (Which you can always appeal.)



45th Ward Report



The New Water Tax and How You Can Save Money

As many are already aware, the Mayor's new water tax passed City Council on September 14. Though I, along with nine of my colleagues, raised concerns regarding this

regressive tax and the seemingly overstated revenue projections by the Administration, it was not enough to prevent it from passing.

The projected costs for non-metered accounts is inflated when compared to metered accounts. Currently, median annual charges for a non-metered account is \$834.39, versus \$407.67 for metered accounts. In 2021, those bills go up to \$1,109.24 for non-metered accounts, versus \$541.96 for metered. That represents a 49% difference when billed based by consumption.

Given that, I fully expect the 7,427 households in the 45th Ward that are non-metered to request a meter so

they might realize these savings. Overall, the water rates in Chicago are low when compared nationally. However, that is cold comfort when household budgets are strained. I encourage every resident to request a water meter as both a conservation and cost saving measure. This will soften the blow of these increases for years to come. Even if you are a heavy user, you're guaranteed to not pay more than your current estimated bill for the next seven years. My experience is a savings of about 50 percent since having a metered installed in 2012.

Time is of the essence, though. First, the additional tax will start January 1, 2017. Additionally, I learned during the Finance Committee hearings that the Department of Water Management can only install 25,000 meters a year at their current rate of installation. We've urged Water Management to ramp up their installation program. But if you are one of the more than 7,400 water customers in the 45th Ward without a meter, there is no time to waste to sign up for a water meter. Sign up today at the city's MeterSave website.
