O'Hare Update: Fly Quiet Rotation Test Survey

Fifty percent of the Runway Rotation Test has been completed, and the Chicago Department of Aviation will be compiling data including submitted surveys.

The O'Hare Noise Compatibility Commission (ONCC) needs accurate information from residents who complete the online surveys. The survey will serve as one component to measure if the runway rotation test was a successful aircraft noise abatement program. Once the rotation test is completed on December 25th, the Fly Quiet Program will return to its original format. Be Heard: Please take a moment to take this online survey. Follow this link: goo.gl/X3N0v1

ONCC can make an educated recommendation to continue the interim Fly Quiet Runway Rotation plan only if it has all the test data information and surveys.

Are Your Property Taxes Too High?

Every 3 years the Cook County Assessor reassesses your home. The new assessed value is used to calculate your property taxes. You can appeal your assessed value yourself, or hire an attorney who will charge you only if they reduce your taxes, typically 33% of 1st year of tax savings. There are 3 levels of appeal. If you're not happy with your result, appeal to the next level.

- 1. **Cook County Assessor.com** You can appeal when our Jefferson Township is open for appeals. This year it was open July 14 to August 15, 2016.
- 2. Cook County Board of Review.com You still have time to appeal 2016 taxes. Check their website periodically for the dates Jefferson Township will be open for appeal.
- 3. **Illinois Property Tax Appeal Board (PTAB)** –www. ptab.illinois.gov Once you receive your results from the Board of Review, you can appeal one more level to PTAB.

You can appeal on uniformity with comparable neighbors' homes, overvaluation, or errors in your property description. Appeal results for steps 1-2 take about 8 weeks. Results for step 3 can take up to 5 years.

Due to the Cubs playoff game, the CAPS meeting was shorter than usual. Sgt. Kontil reported that the Russell house, a trouble building in the area of Central Park and Sunnyside, has been quieter. There were no new issues reported in West Walker, all of which is in Beat 1723.

As always, call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood and provide detailed descriptions of the individuals and vehicles involved in any incident. Even if a neighbor has already reported the incident or activity, other neighbors should make separate calls. The police often look at the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers and resources with respect to a particular situation or incident. CAPS meetings for our beat are currently held monthly at the 17th District Police Station, 4650 N. Pulaski, in the Community Room. Meetings begin at 7:30 p.m. on the third Wednesday of the month and typically

last one hour. The next regularly scheduled meeting for Beat 1723 is Wednesday, November 16, 2016. 39th Ward Report



By the time you read this, the Cubs will have won the World Series and the country will have elected a new President! Our big local news is, the Independence Branch of the Chicago Public Library (CPL) will have a new permanent home in West Walker. CPL and the Chicago Housing Authority have joined forces to

build a new 10,000-to 14,000-square-foot Independence branch, along with senior housing, at 4024 N. Elston, the Hollerbach Funeral Home site. A new Independence library would not have happened without community support. No one has been more supportive over the years than West Walker's Roberta Bole, President of Friends of Independence Library. Thank you to Roberta and all of the West Walker residents who have advocated for a new, permanent library. Next steps include a design competition followed by construction. I will keep you updated with news and progress reports.

November 30 is the deadline for the Chicago Property Tax Rebate. If your household income was under \$75,000 in 2015, you may qualify for the rebate. You must apply in person at one of the 26 sites in Chicago, including the Albany Park Library, 3401 W. Foster. Their hours are Mondays and Wednesdays 10-5, Tuesdays and Thursdays 12-7, and Fridays and Saturdays from 9-4. For more information about the program, and the documentation you need to bring when you apply, please visit cityofchicago.org/city/en.html.

Please remember that on Thursday, December 1, Chicago reactivates its Winter Overnight Parking Ban for the most critical arterial streets. Signs for this seasonal restriction are permanently posted. Parking on arterial streets where these signs are posted will result in vehicles being ticketed and towed between the hours of 3:00 a.m. until 7:00 a.m., whether or not there is snow on the ground. This parking restriction will be in effect until April 1.

News From Irving Park Community Food Pantry

Pantry's Holiday Distributions Need Donations

The Irving Park Community Food Pantry has begun gathering donations for its two holiday distributions, in November and on December 21st. We are asking for contributions of funds, food and fun (i.e., books and toys) to make the season brighter for those in our community who need a helping hand during the holiday season.

In November, we provide clients during our regular weekly distributions with additional meat and trimmings for a Thanksgiving dinner. On December 21st, we hold a special distribution at which clients receive the makings for a full holiday dinner. We also allow clients to select a gift for each of their children, along with a book and stocking stuffer.

For these special distributions, we are especially in need of juice, stuffing, cranberry sauce, canned yams and vegetables, instant potatoes, cake mixes, Jell-O and pumpkin-pie filling.

We typically give out about 400 toys to children (ages infant to 12). For some, it will be the only gift they receive. We especially need gifts for older children (age 10 to 12), especially boys, as we receive far fewer for that age group. Soccer balls and basketballs are popular options.

We also run out of books for all ages early in the day. We find older boys, a harder group to shop for, enjoy biographies, sports and other nonfiction books.

Unwrapped new toys and food donations can be brought to the Pantry at the Irving Park United Methodist Church (3801 N. Keeler Ave.) during office hours (call 773/283-6262 to check times). Donations can be left at the bottom of the stairs at the Grace Street entrance. They also can be brought in from 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on Wednesdays during Pantry operating hours. Local businesses in the area also help collect donations; we'll post them to our Facebook page.

The deadline for contributing toys is Friday, December 16th. Volunteers are needed to collect toys, organize the toy room, and help with the toy distribution on December 21. For information or to volunteer, contact Sara Yoest at sara.yoest74@gmail.com.


