Holiday Thanks from the Pantry!

Thank you to Alderman John Arena, State Representative Jaime Andrade, Toy Room Coordinators Sara Yoest and Debby Fries and all the annual and weekly volunteers who helped with the Pantry's Holiday program on December 20th.

We served 272 households with a total of 1,044 people, giving them the makings of a holiday meal for their entire family. We also distributed 351 toys to 139 pantry clients, along with plenty more games, stocking stuffers, books, hats, gloves and blankets. Overall, we gave out more than 800 items. We also gave pet food to 144 households for their many dogs, cats, and birds, two guinea pigs and one rabbit.

After our program, due to the generosity of our community, we were able to donate 60 toys to the Magic After-School Place program run by Carlson Community Services, 28 to the IPUMC Hispanic Mission, three bags to Sherwood Elementary School in Englewood (100% low income student body) and two

45th Ward Report



Update on The Point at Six Corners Development

For several months, we have been in discussions with the owners The Point at Six Corners on the future of the development. Although a plan for 100,000 square-foot of retail at the location has already received city approvals, and permits were issued,

the owner chose not to move forward with construction.

My office has reengaged the owner in a discussion on how to move this development forward. We have repeatedly pointed the owner toward the Six Corners Master Plan as a guide, and the owner is considering adding a residential component to the site and partnering with a senior living provider. Those discussions continue, focusing on the potential height of the structure, the retail and parking mix, and how the building addresses and adheres to the Six Corners Master Plan.

We have made much progress over the last six years at Six Corners, and in all our business districts. From Binny's and Culver's at Six Corners, to Weston's and Tipsy Cow Cantina in Jefferson Park, to Midwest Kitchen and Mini City 21 in Gladstone Park, my office has worked hard to foster a hospitable businesses environment, unstick city red tape, and encourage reluctant landlords to fill their vacant commercial spaces. Those efforts have resulted in real commercial gains throughout the ward.

While I share the general frustration with the delays at The Point, I am dedicated to bringing development to that space that works for the betterment of our community. It is more important to get development of this scale done right than it is to take the first offer.

I look forward to updating you with more information as it becomes available. Once we have a coherent plan that meets our community's high standards, I will host a community meeting to introduce the plan. Until then, any proposal is speculative.

CAPS Report

Beats 1722 & 1723 Meeting, December 20, 2017

Important Notice: Beginning in January, the Beat 1722/1723 CAPS meeting will start at 7:00 p.m.

Present: CAPS Officer Hamid, three Beat officers Officer Hamid reported two shootings in December, one at 3800 Leland and the other in the 4300 block of Central Park. Both are believed to be gang related. He also reported that there has been an increase in robberies and car thefts in Beat 1723 – roughly Pulaski to Kimball. Robberies are occurring in gangways and alleys. He urged residents to remain vigilant, avoid going out late at night and listen to your sixth sense. He demonstrated a small personal alarm that sets off a shrill alarm by just pulling a pin.

There has been an increase in package theft and thefts from cars that often happens during the month of December. Always lock your car doors and doors and windows at home.

A resident asked about the fire in mid-December at the apartment building in the 3800 block of Montrose. The fire is still under investigation.

A representative from Youth Outreach Services was introduced. YOS works with families who may have a troubled child or a child exhibiting negative behaviors. Services for youths aged 12-21 are designed to promote social engagement, manage and improve negative behaviors and build self-confidence. Officer Hamid passed around photos of recently arrested suspects. He reported that a sting operation in the 4200 block of Pulaski resulted in the arrest of a woman for possession of 500 grams of cannabis. The meeting ended with best wishes for a happy holidays.

Call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood and provide detailed descriptions of the individuals and vehicles involved in any incident. Even if a neighbor has already reported the incident or activity, other neighbors should make separate calls. The police often look at the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers and resources with respect to a particular situation or incident. CAPS meetings for our beat are currently held monthly at the 17th District Police Station, 4650 N. Pulaski, in the Community Room. Starting in January 2018, meetings

Are you interested in recycling your Christmas Tree? Residents of the City of Chicago are invited to bring their Christmas Trees to North Park Village (5801 N Pulaski Road) from Saturday,

January 6 through Saturday, January 20. The trees will be chipped and turned into mulch that will be available to residents.

With winter comes snow, and many people rely on walking and transit as their primary way to get around. Without a wide, clear path through snow and ice, it is especially difficult for people with disabilities, seniors and children to walk safely. Please remember that it is the responsibility of homeowners and occupants to remove snow and ice from the sidewalks according to the Municipal Code of Chicago.

On December 1, at 3:00 a.m. the City of Chicago activated the Winter Overnight Parking Restrictions for the most critical arterial streets between the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. This seasonal parking restriction is in effect until April I, whether or not there is snow on the ground. Please be mindful of signs when parking this winter.




