#### News From Irving Park Lutheran Church

Senior Volunteer Opportunity with AARP The RSVP program partners with non-profits throughout Chicago and places volunteers 55 and over with those non-profits. The RSVP program in Chicago is sponsored by AARP Foundation. Every summer AARP Foundation hosts a meal pack in 5 cities and this year Chicago is one of them. It will be on Saturday, August 4th, at the Wintrust Arena. During the event, 1 million meals will be packed by 5,000 volunteers. The event relies heavily on the volunteer role of Table Captain. Table Captains lead teams through the packing. Qualifications for Table Captain includes: the ability to lead a group of 12-15 individuals, remain on your feet for 2-3 hours and be preferably age 55 and over. ## City Sticker/CityKey ID Event June 22

On Friday, June 22, I will host a City Sticker Sale and CityKey ID event from 10 am to 2 pm in the annex space at the Copernicus Center, 5214 W. Lawrence. To purchase a vehicle sticker, bring your 2018 Chicago

city vehicle courtesy reminder form or your state vehicle registration card, which includes your Vehicle Identification Number (VIN). The ward sale is limited to drivers with stickers expiring June 30. All motorists must purchase and display their vehicle sticker July 1 to avoid tickets.

This year, **no cash payments are accepted.** Accepted forms include check, money order, and major credit cards. To purchase your city sticker before June 30, go to the City Clerk's satellite office at 5430 W. Gale Street, most currency exchanges (service fees may apply), purchase online (http://bit.ly/EZBuy), or via mail following instructions on the back of your renewal notice.

At this year's event, residents will have the opportunity to purchase a **City of Chicago CityKey ID**. The CityKey ID program was established to bring Chicago together as one community. The CityKey program enables Chicagoans an opportunity to obtain an optional, valid, government-issued ID. CityKey ID acts as a Ventra card, library card, and offers an array of benefits at various businesses and organizations throughout the city. Chicago residents of any age can obtain a CityKey ID either at the mobile printing event on June 22 or by scheduling an appointment online with the City Clerk's office at www.getcitykey.com. ## **CAPS** Report

Beats 1722 & 1723 Meeting May 16, 2018

In attendance: 17th District Commander Susan Moss, CAPS Officer Maryjane Parks, CAPS Officer Hamid, Ald. Deb Mell (33rd Ward), Gail Beitz, Alderman Laurino's Office (39th Ward), Jessica Vasquez, Alderman Carlos Ramirez-Rosa's Office (35th Ward)

Ald. Deb Mell stated that the 17th District is low on officers. All 17th District Aldermen are urging CPD to send graduating recruits to replace the many officers who have retired within the past few years. At the end of May, 10 recruits will be assigned to the 17th District, but Mell feels more are needed. CDR Moss explained that during the day, there is one officer in one car to patrol each Beat. At night, there are two officers in one car per Beat. More officers are needed for Rapid Response Cars, which respond to crimes in progress. Recently, more patrols have been dedicated to Central Park, between Montrose and Leland where there was a recent shooting

CDR Moss introduced a guest speaker from the Office of Emergency Management and Communications (OEMC). According to Sue from OEMC, there are 5 million 911

calls received annually. About 36 people take the calls. There are two types of call takers – police and fire. If you are reporting a crime, you may remain anonymous. Clearly state your request to remain anonymous to the 911 call-taker. The call-taker will note this and your information will be unavailable to the dispatcher. If you are the victim of a crime, you cannot remain anonymous.

When to call 911 vs. 311: If a crime is in progress, or there's immediate threat to life or bodily injury, or there is major property damage or loss due to crime, call 911. Call 311 to request City Services and report situations not requiring an immediate police response (file a police report, report auto theft or other offense when the suspect is no longer at the scene).

In September, OEMC will roll out Smart 911 which will enable 911 call-takers to better pinpoint callers' locations calling from mobile devices. Currently, 911 call-takers can track a cell phone to a 6-9 block radius. Smart 911 will report a physical address, as it does now land lines.

A number of package thefts were reported in late April and May in the West Walker area. Have your packages delivered to a secure location if at all possible. A few arrests for package theft have been made recently.

On Thursday, June 14, City Vehicle and Residential Zone Parking Stickers will be available in my 39th Ward Office (4404 W. Lawrence Ave.) from 10 am to 2 pm. Ward sales are limited to customers with "June" vehicle sticker expirations. NO CASH will be accepted at the ward office sale. All major credit cards, money orders, and checks are the only forms of payment accepted for the purchase of Chicago City of Chicago Vehicle Stickers.

On Saturday, June 16, from 9 am until noon, bring any papers you would like shredded to Coletti's Restaurant (5707 N. Central). Hosted by Represenative John D'Amico and myself, this event will allow you to safely and securely shred and recycle your sensitive documents for free! Limit of two boxes per person, do not leave boxes at site, remember to remove all staples and paper clips before bringing in your documents. This event is for residents only, NO BUSINESSES.

I am proud to announce that my office is a drop off location for Operation Help-a-Hero. We are accepting donations of household items for homeless veterans until July 5. Drop off **only new, store-bought** items during business hours. All materials will be collected by Military Outreach USA and the American Red Cross to be delivered to the United States' Department of Veterans' Affairs.

#### News From Irving Park Community Food Pantry

#### **Pantry Planning Herb Garden**

The Irving Park Community Food Pantry is starting up its Herb Garden for the year at the Irving Park United Methodist Church in the space adjacent to the Pantry entrance just off Keeler Ave. alongside the Serenity and Prayer Garden. We are seeking donations to help continue to provide clients with fresh herbs every week throughout the summer and fall.

The garden is a collaboration with Three Brothers Garden, which operates its own garden for the Pantry, and IPUMC. The herbs that we grow, comprising basil, oregano, cilantro, thyme, parsley, mint, rosemary and sage, are harvested early Wednesday mornings and distributed to clients later that day. Volunteer Jeri Winkels coordinates the feeding, care and cutting of the weekly herbs with a variety of volunteers.

The garden flourishes, and we provide more than 50 bags of herbs each week to clients. We are now looking for donations to increase production, such as organic soils, garden tools (trowels, weeders, spades, rakes and aerators), garden gloves, small baggies and herb plants. We also need volunteers to help tend the garden during the week or sponsors who will "adopt" one of the herb beds and tend it. We also are looking for tried-and-true recipes that will maximize the use of the herbs that we can use in classes for our clients.

Visit us at the GIPNA Farmers Market in Independence Park on Sunday, June 10th and 24th. Volunteers will be staffing our booth to answer questions, accept donations and sell (for a donation) merchandise such as lunch bags and water bottles.

We know this is unfortunate timing, but with no newsletter in July we wanted to remind you that as you (shudder) shop for back-to-school supplies later this summer to keep us in mind. We will once again be providing our clients' children with supplies in August. Items include loose-leaf paper, spiral notebooks, pocket folders, glue sticks, scissors, rulers, erasers, #2 pencils, crayons (24 pack), markers, colored pencils and pens. We do not want backpacks. Details of drop-offs will be listed on our Facebook page.






