The police often look at the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers and resources with respect to a particular situation or incident. Meetings are held on the third Wednesday of the month and typically last one hour. The next regularly scheduled meeting for Beat 1723 is Wednesday, June 19, 2019 at 7:00 pm. News From Irving Park Community Food Pantry

Community Aids Pantry

The Irving Park Community Food Pantry wants to thank the variety of organizations and people who recently have supported the Pantry with special contributions of time and money:

Pat Eisenhart and family, for their donation in memory of Bob Eisenhart, a long-time volunteer driver for the Pantry's homebound-delivery program. The money helped purchase a 2015 Ford Transit 250 truck that will replace our current truck. Thanks also to the FDC Foundation, which donated \$2,000 to our truck fund, and Scott Sim from S&T Automotive, a regular supporter, who helped locate the vehicle and negotiate a price.

The Irving Park Jewel branch of TCF, whose manager, Cindy Paredes, along with staffers Cynthia Delgado and Alicia Benitez, brought in a \$500 donation and then stayed to help at food stations.

Karina Miska, who asked her customers to donate extra boxes of Girl Scout cookies she was selling to give to Pantry clients, she and her mother, Charity, brought in two cases of cookies in mid-April, and they put them on our distribution line to be given out right away.

Eight students from Lane Tech, who volunteered during their Spring break and received service hours for their hard work. We are always willing to work with high school students during breaks or in the summer.

Eight employees from ConAgra, who worked a number of food stations and performed other duties for one distribution in April.

Heather and the staff at Pet Supplies Plus on Elston, who donate all the returned pet food they take in and set up a donation basket for customers to donate treats and toys for Pantry clients.

All of our Easter basket-program volunteers, comprising Tuesday night volunteers Chris and Jenny Delaney along with their son Alex, plus Bob Hostettler and Colleen O'Rourke and Wednesday volunteers Jessica Hartkopf, Emil DeJulio, Sharon Spellman and Aaron Pendleton. In all, the program gave out 190 baskets over three weeks.

We appreciate all their help and that of everyone in the community who supports our mission of being "Neighbors Helping Neighbors!"

Garden volunteers determined that a low yield and pest infestation that occurred in 2018 were likely due to tired soil. So after the harvest of a spring crop of radishes and lettuces, we'll add organic matter and plant the raised beds with a nutrient-restoring crop. We'll be back to growing vegetables for the Irving Park Food Pantry's clients in the fall or next spring at the latest.
