Your Property Taxes Are Increasing. What Can You Do?

Hi Neighbors! In 2021, every 3 years, our properties are reassessed. Many have asked me what to do about their assessment increase. The first step was to appeal to the Cook County Assessor by September 17. If you missed our Jefferson Township deadline, (or already appealed), here are some additional options.

- 1. File an appeal with the Cook County Board of Review. Pre-file online now or wait until Jefferson Township opens for appeals. Go to cookcountyboardofreview.com or call 312-603-5542. Someone actually answers the phone :-).
- 2. File an appeal with the Illinois Property Tax Appeal Board (PTAB) – www.ptab.illinois.gov after you have appealed to the Board of Review.
- Apply for all your property exemptions to reduce your taxes. There are 8 – Homeowner, Senior & Senior Freeze, Returning & Veteran, Home Improvement, Longtime Homeowner, Disabilities.
- 4. File yourself or hire an attorney. Attorney fee typically only applies when your taxes decrease. Fee is typically 33% of your tax savings.*Sources: CCOA, BOR, PTAB*

CAPS Report

Beats 1722 & 1723

September 15, 2021 - Hybrid Meeting Zoom and In-Person

In Attendance: Caps Officer Jerry Zander, Affinity Officer Dena Wetherspoon, Sgt. Debbie Iza, Community Organizer John Campos, Erika Wozniak from Ald. Nugent's Office (39th)

Officer Wetherspoon talked about her new assignment as Affinity Officer. She will be working with certain affinity groups – religious, LGBTQ, immigrants, unhoused.

Officer Zander reported on crime statistics year-to-date in the 17th District. Overall, major crimes are down. Homicides are at 3, compared with 7 in 2020. Shootings are at 35, compared with 45 in 2020. There are 115 robberies, compared with 146 in 2020. Burglaries are up slightly at 172 vs. 165. Motor vehicle thefts are 159 compared with 215 in 2020.

Since July, officers have recovered 24 illegal guns. Tac officers are being proactive in making traffic stops which

have resulted in weapons charges and gun recoveries. On September 3 at 1:00 p.m. in the 4200 block of Pulaski during a traffic stop officers recovered a gun and an individual was arrested for a felony unlawful use of weapons charge. On September 13th a large number of drugs and shell casing were found in a stolen vehicle on the 4500 block of N. Drake.

Erika Wozniak spoke on behalf of Ald. Nugent (39th), but the phone recording the Zoom didn't pick up her voice. A resident asked questions about how/when/ why parking tickets are issued, but the full question and answers couldn't be heard over Zoom.

A question was asked about two incidents of shots fired in the 4100 block of Avers, at Belle Plaine. Officer Zander reported that the incidents were unrelated and there is no illegal activity in that vicinity that they are aware of. A resident asked about shots fired in the 4100 block of W. Belle Plaine on Sept. 6 at 8:30 a.m. Police responded and found damage to a vehicle and shell casings were recovered. No one is in custody.

A discussion was held about leaving your name vs. remaining anonymous when calling 911. Officers





reported that you will receive better service if you leave your name and that your identity won't be revealed.

Call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood and provide detailed descriptions of the individuals and vehicles involved in any incident. Even if a neighbor has already reported the incident or activity, other neighbors should make separate calls. The police rely on the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers to a district. The next meeting will be on Wednesday, October 20th at 6:30 p.m. in person and on Zoom. 


