National American Veterans Museum reopens January 5.

In our museum we display various artworks from the NVAM collection. In addition we show special exhibitions, as well as participating in traveling exhibitions. Current exhibitions include:

Above and Beyond - on display at The Harold Washington Library-400 S. State St.-Above and Beyond comprises 58,307 dog tags. Each dog tag represents a person in the Vietnam War and is arranged in date order of death. And, each dog tag shows their name, date of death and military branch.

The Things They Carried - inspired by Tim O'Brien's book *The Things They Carried*, this exhibit serves as a visual companion that illustrates the narrative with fine art and photography from veterans that lived the stories in the novel.

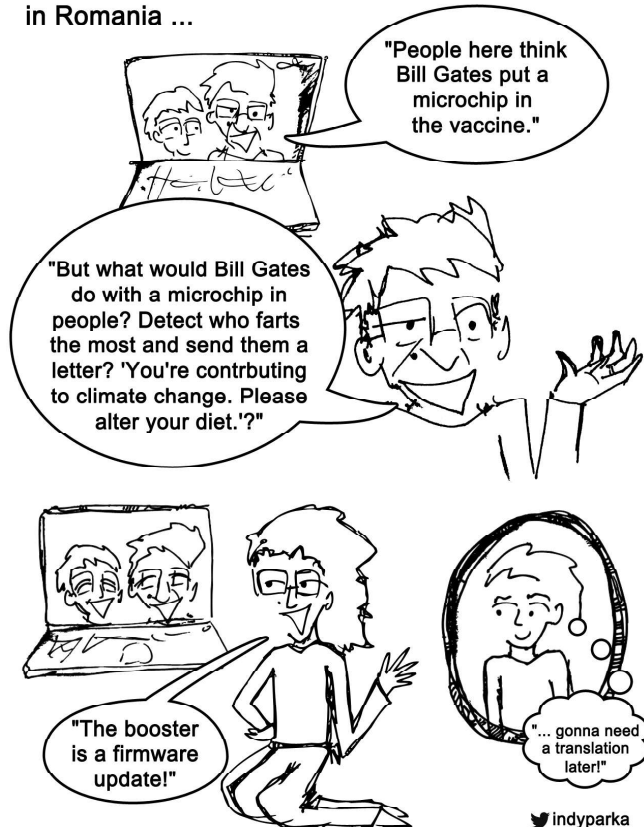
We Are Resilience: Masks of Hope - inspired by an art therapy technique with veterans, Kids Rank partnered

What Can We Expect in 2022?

Happy New Year neighbors! Here are a few predictions for Chicago real estate this year.

1. Mortgage rates are projected to increase to 3.7% by the end of 2022.
2. Chicago home prices could increase up to 7.6%.
3. There will be a continued shortage of homes for sale in Chicago ranging from -5% to -15% depending on the month.
4. March, April, May & June could see the greatest number of home sales and the highest sale prices.
5. Supply chain issues will be resolved and we will see more new construction homes.
6. Urban living will become more attractive again due to the availability of vaccines and a return to working in the office.

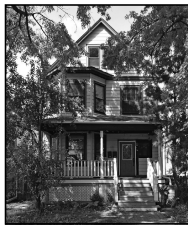

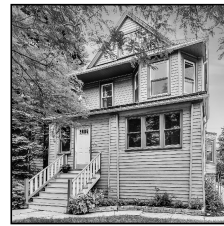

He is a prestigious cello instructor and judge for young cellist competitions and coach for chamber music festivals and youth orchestras, and has taught hundreds of young cellists over the last 30 years.

In-Person Transactions at Driver Facilities to Re-Open Jan. 18

Due to an increase in COVID-19 cases statewide, Illinois Secretary of State Jesse White is announcing that all Secretary of State departments will not conduct in-person transactions – including Driver Services facilities – from Jan. 3, 2022, through Jan. 17, 2022. All departments and Driver Services facilities will reopen on Tuesday, Jan. 18. White is encouraging the public to visit ilsos.gov for online services. Online transactions will remain open for all departments to conduct office services, including, but not limited to the following:

- Renewing a license plate sticker.
- Renewing a driver's license or ID card for those who qualify (individuals may call 217-785-1424 to confirm their eligibility or to obtain their PIN).
- Obtaining a duplicate driver's license or ID card.
- Obtaining a driver record abstract.
- Filing Business Services documents, such as incorporations and annual reports.

In addition, the Drivers and Vehicles Services hotline phone number will remain open at 800-252-8980. Customers with issues involving administrative hearings

may email adminhearings@ilsos.gov or call 312-793-3722 or 217-782-7065.

As a reminder, White has extended all driver's license and ID card expiration dates to March 31, 2022. This extension does not apply to commercial driver's licenses (CDL) and CDL learner's permits.

In addition, White has expanded remote renewal for driver's license and ID card holders. Since this fall, White's office mailed letters to eligible customers with expired driver's licenses and ID cards requiring them to renew online, by phone or by mail. The office estimates that this helps to eliminate the need for approximately 1 million people to visit a facility.
