

Is the Market Changing?

The simple answer yes. The main reason is mortgage interest rates. The Fed has been increasing the Fed Funds Rate to help reduce inflation. It has impacted mortgage rates, which increased from 3% to 5.5% in the last year.

What does that mean? A buyer getting a \$400,000 mortgage now has to pay \$585 more per month for the same loan. Buyers aren't qualifying for as high a loan and have to lower their purchase price range.

We are seeing fewer multiple offers & it's taking longer to sell. Some buyers are waiting, hoping home prices and mortgage rates will come down. Rates will eventually come down. However, home prices are projected to increase, but at a slower rate. I have tools to help buyers decide.



Buyers and sellers also wonder what will happen to home prices if there is a recession. Historically, the majority of the time, home

CAPS Report Beats 1722 & 1723 August 17, 2022—No Report

The Chicago Police Department is offering cash rewards for tips leading to charges and convictions. \$5,000 for tips leading to gun trafficking charges and convictions and up to \$15,000 for tips leading to homicide charges and convictions. Callers are 100% anonymous. The number to call to leave a tip is 833-408-0069.

Call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood and provide detailed descriptions of the individuals and vehicles involved in any incident. Even if a neighbor has already reported the incident or activity, other neighbors should make separate calls. The police rely on the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers to a district. **The next meeting will be on Wednesday, September 21, 2022, at 6:30 pm** in the 17th District Community Room, 4650 N. Pulaski. Remember to always lock your vehicle, never leave it running unattended and be on the lookout for scams involving COVID-19 cures and scams related to income tax refunds. Remember, the IRS will never call you on the phone.


