How's the Market?

The housing boom in Chicago is slowing down due to rising mortgage rates. Some buyers are lowering the price range they can afford. Many buyers are still jumping in because they understand the emotional and financial benefits of homeownership. The timing is still right for many buyers and for some, rents are increasing as much as inflation, making homeownership appealing.

Sellers who need to sell and buy are wondering what their new monthly payment will be given higher mortgage rates.

There is good news for both buyers and sellers. Buyers (and sellers who also need to buy) realize what goes up must come down. They are still buying homes with the viewpoint that the mortgage rates will come down in a year or two and they can refinance into a lower rate/monthly payment. And there are other strategies like rate buy downs (paid by the buyer or the seller), rate locks before purchase, and homebuyer programs (e.g., first-time homebuyer, Illinois grants).

There is still a shortage of homes for sale. In Chicago, homes for sale are down 18% versus last year. Average market time to sell is still 60 days.

In Irving Park, there are 12% fewer homes and 35% fewer condos for sale versus the same time last year. Home prices year-to-date are up 16% versus last year and condo prices are up 2%. *Source: MRED, CAR*

Chicago Police Department is offering cash rewards for tips leading to charges and convictions. \$5,000 for tips leading to gun trafficking charges and convictions and up to \$15,000 for tips leading to homicide charges and convictions. Callers are 100% anonymous. The number to call to leave a tip is 833-408-0069.

Call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood and provide detailed descriptions of the individuals and vehicles involved in any incident. Even if a neighbor has already reported the incident or activity, other neighbors should make separate calls. The police rely on the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers to a district. **The next meeting will be on Wednesday, November 16 at 6:30 pm** in the 17th District Community Room, 4650 N. Pulaski.

Remember to always lock your vehicle; never leave it running unattended. Be on the lookout for scams involving COVID-19 cures, and scams related to income tax refunds. Remember, the IRS will never call you on the phone.


