Dear Neighbor,

I have heard many people wishing to put 2022 behind us. It is good to now say it's 2023, but a change in the calendar is just a start. Each of the three alderpeople representing West Walker, as well as the mayor, are incumbents running for reelection on **Tuesday, February 28, 2023**. Although the Chicago Police Department and the Mayor's office keep telling us there is an overall lower rate of crime over many sectors, I know Neighbors also feel that where they live—here in West Walker and in the surrounding area—property crime and violent crime have only increased. Now is the time to reach out to our soon-to-be elected officials and insist that safety be a priority in their next terms.

The increase in crime has many of our Neighbors concerned. Lock your home, even when at home. Lock your car at all times. Light your yard at night. Be aware of your surroundings. Don't open your door to strangers. If you see something suspicious, call 911. If there is an ongoing problem or issue, call your alderperson. Please attend CAPS meetings. Information about past and upcoming CAPS meetings appear in the Wire. As you know, West Walker is broken into three separate wards. Contact information for our area aldermanic wards is below:

39th Ward Aldermanic Candidate Forum on January 19

33rd Ward Participatory Budgeting Voting Through January 20

Alderwoman Rossana Rodriguez Sanchez invites you to participate in the Participatory Budgeting (PB) process, where the community decides how \$1 million of the ward's infrastructure funds will be used. A committee of neighbors that works with the Alderwoman's office to run the PB process has collected ideas from the community and is finalizing this year's ballot. Last year, over 1,000 residents voted, and the ward is hoping to beat that number! Voting is open now through January 20. Ways to Communicate Your Care for Our Neighborhoods

Turn your porch light on from dusk until dawn every night and encourage your neighbors to do the same. Make it part of your daily routine, or install a timer or light bulbs with automatic photocell/solar sensors.

Well-lit neighborhoods communicate a strong message of care for the neighborhood by its residents, make the street feel more welcome to neighbors who are out for a walk in the evening, and may help lead to a decline in crime. Turning on porch lights is a simple way to start this process. It is also immediate: for example, if you're waiting for the installation of a new streetlight, you can go ahead and add a little more light yourself.

Shovel your sidewalks each time snow accumulates. It is required by law (www.chicago.gov/city/en/depts/cdot/supp_info/sidewalk_snow_removal.html) and it's the right thing to do. Our neighbors rely on sidewalks to access public transportation and local food stores. Shovel a sidewalk and walkway to the front door for yourself, and for an elderly neighbor!

What Can We Expect in 2023?

Happy New Year neighbors! Here are a few predictions for Chicago real estate this year.

- 1. Mortgage rates** are projected to decrease to 6% by Q4 2023 as inflation decreases. The 30-year rate should eventually equal the 10-year Treasury rate +1.79%. Rates appear to have peaked and started moving down in November 2022.
- 2. Home prices** nationally on average are projected to increase 0.4%. Zillow forecasts Chicago home prices could decrease 0.7%. The continued shortage of homes for sale will help stabilize prices in Chicago.
- 3. Buyers will return to the market** as inflation and therefore mortgage rates continue to come down. Demand among millennials will drive the real estate market forward.
- 4. The housing market** is well positioned to lead the economy out of a possible brief recession.
- 5. Urban living** will become more attractive again due to the availability of vaccine boosters and workers returning to the office.

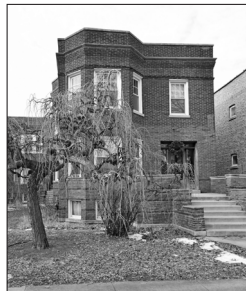

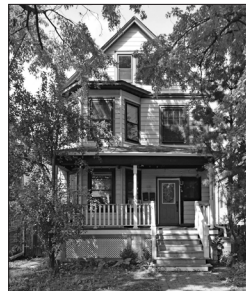

CAPS Report

Beats 1722 & 1723

November 16, 2022 Meeting – In-Person

In attendance: CAPS Officer John Becker; John Campos, CPD Community Organizer; Ald. Samantha Nugent (39th); Eric Ramos from Ald. Rosanna Rodriguez’s office (33rd); Katie, Chief of Staff for State Rep. Mike Kelly (15th District).

CAPS Officer John Becker facilitated the meeting. He has recently been assigned to the CAPS office, but previously served 18 years in the 17th District, so he knows it well. Long-time CAPS Officer Jerry Zanders has retired and his replacement, Darryel Boone, was promoted to detective. There will likely be more changes coming to the 17th District CAPS office.

Please call Alderman Nugent’s 39th Ward office at 773-736-5594 if street or alley lights are out. Provide the closest address. She also encouraged residents to call 911 if they see suspicious activity or a crime in progress. More calls for service can result in more officers in the district.

Officer Becker went through the Beat packet. He explained the importance of the Court Advocacy process in giving neighbors a voice in the prosecution of dangerous individuals. He reviewed several CPD events taking place in November.

A resident asked if there was information available about the exchange of gunfire between two vehicles on October 3 at 3:20 pm at Pulaski and Berteau. Officer Becker didn’t have the information on hand, but asked the resident to follow up with him by phone.

Several residents were at the meeting to discuss concerns about a problem house in the 4600 block of Central Park. Officer Becker said that many city departments are working on this problem house.

Call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood and provide detailed descriptions of the individuals and vehicles involved in any incident. Even if a neighbor has already reported the incident or activity, other neighbors should make separate calls. The police rely on the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers to a district. **There was no December meeting. The next meeting will be on Wednesday, January 18 at 6:30 pm** in the 17th District Community Room, 4650 N. Pulaski.

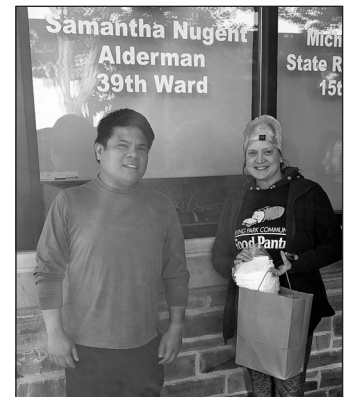
Help Wanted: DoorDash Delivery Program
