WWCA Officer Nominations are Open Through March 22!

All nominees must reside in the West Walker community, bordered west to east between Pulaski Ave. and Central Park Ave., north to south between Montrose Ave. and Irving Park Rd.

The current WWCA Officers and Board Members are transitioning off the board with the President Pro Tem to become a Board Member. WWCA is currently seeking nominations for the following Officer positions (2-year term beginning May 2023–2025):

President: The President focuses on the core functions of the organization to enable it to achieve its long-term vision. Areas of focus include: strategy, board management, fundraising, engagement, communication. The President shall preside over all meetings of members and executive board. The President will also cast a deciding vote in case of a tie.

Vice President: Perform those functions delegated to the Vice President by the President, in the absence of the President the Vice President shall preside at the meetings of the Association membership and/or Executive Board and perform all duties of the President. Serve as the chair of at least one committee that is operational in scope.

Secretary: Keeps the minutes of the proceedings of membership and Executive Board meetings, presents minutes for approval, ensures all notices are given in accordance with the by-laws, notify WWCA membership of all meetings, keeps active tally of volunteer records, and maintains clear records of Association Business. Serve as chair of at least one committee.

WEST WALKER CIVIC ASSOCIATION ELECTIONS ARE COMING. Please see the details in this issue of the Wire (front cover and below) about the nominating and election process for new West Walker Civic Association officers. Now that we are out of the pandemic, we are ready to rebuild the organization with an eye toward the future.

LOCAL ELECTIONS ARE NOT OVER. By the time you receive this issue, the February 28 election should be decided. However, that doesn't mean that all of the individual races will have been decided. Locally, it is expected that the race for the 45th Ward Alderman's office will face a runoff election on April 4, 2023, between the two top vote recipients. It is also expected that the race for Chicago mayor will be undecided on February 28, and a runoff election between the two top vote-getting candidates will also occur on April 4, 2023. Stay engaged!

A CORRECTION. On a programming note, a helpful neighbor noted that my February Dear Neighbor had some incorrect information regarding the elections. As of the redistricting and this election cycle in 2023, the northeast portion of West Walker is no longer part of the 35th ward, and now is part of the 33rd ward. That will be reflected on any garage sale materials forthcoming and additional election alerts.

How's the Market?

Hi Neighbors,

The real estate market in our West Walker neighborhood is going strong. There was a lull the last few months due to colder weather and higher mortgage rates. But buyers have adjusted to current rates and are back buying. For homes priced correctly, we're seeing the return of multiple offers. It continues to be a sellers' market due to a shortage of homes for sale. Sellers are getting 96% to 99% of their asking price depending on whether you are selling a multi-family (96%), a condo (98%) or a single-family home (99%). Here are a few other West Walker statistics:

Single Family Homes—Median sale price for a 3 bedroom, 2 bath home is \$517,000 and time to contract is 8 days.

Condos/Townhouses—Median sale price for a 2 bedroom, 1 bath is \$205,000 and time to contract is 10 days.

2- to 4-Flats—Median sale price for a 2 unit is \$462,000 and time to contract is 19 days.

Keep in mind, these are averages. Each home is unique with its own special features. Your sale price will depend on the size of your home and lot, what improvements you have made, age of your roof, furnace, water heater, etc. Properly preparing your home for sale and having a good marketing and pricing strategy are key. CAPS Report

Beats 1722 & 1723 February 15, 2023 Meeting

In attendance: CAPS Officer Miro; Adam Roberts, Chief of Staff, and Sam Brewer, Ald. Samantha Nugent's office (39th); Joe Engleman from Ald. Rosanna Rodriguez's office (33rd).

Officer Miro went over crime stats for Beat 1723 over the past month (all of West Walker falls into Beat 1723). He cited several recent arrests including an arrest and murder charge for a homicide that took place December 23, 2022, in the 4500 block of Lawndale. In addition, charges were brought against offenders involved in an armed robbery in the 3100 block of Leland December 12, 2022. The offenders were involved in 17 robberies that night. For the first two weeks of February, 12 weapons were recovered. Officer Miro commended the officers for getting the job done.

A handful of residents were at the meeting to get more information about a shooting that took place outside of the West Walker area at Jensen Park (Wilson and Lawndale). A good portion of the meeting was spent

talking about the incident and what neighbors could do. Officer Miro stressed calling 911 if anyone or anything seems suspicious, calling in any graffiti to 311, calling 911 when a crime has taken place and making sure neighbors do, too. Calls for service can equal more police manpower. More license plate readers and POD (Police Observation Device) cameras can help police track offenders. Also, homeowners can send security camera footage to CPD (see below).

Residents can take advantage of the City's Home and Business Protection Program. Residents can be reimbursed up to \$225 per security camera for a maximum of two cameras purchased on or after June 6, 2022. You can also register your camera with the Chicago Police Department. If you would like to submit video to the 17th district, email it to SDC017@chicagopolice.org. The SDC room is linked to the POD cameras and license plate readers.

Call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood and provide detailed descriptions of the individuals and vehicles involved in any incident.

The police rely on the number of calls for service in determining allocation of officers to a district. **The next meeting will be on Wednesday, March 15 at 6:30 pm** in the 17th District Community Room, 4650 N. Pulaski.

Remember: Always lock your vehicle; never leave it running unattended. Be on the lookout for scams involving COVID-19 cures, and scams related to income tax refunds. The IRS will never call you on the phone.



Irving Park Fine Arts Committee Upcoming Concerts: Sondheim and Fermi String Quartet

The Irving Park Fine Arts Committee is pleased to present A Tribute to Sondheim on Sunday, March 26 at 2 pm (rescheduled from November). The concert will honor the late composer and lyricist Stephen Sondheim who passed away in November 2021. Credited with reinventing the American musical, Sondheim's works include beloved musicals Into the Woods, A Little Night Music, Sweeney Todd, Company and Sunday in the Park with George. The concert will feature noted vocalists Stephanie Stockstill, Rachel Klippel, Christopher Richard and Lazaro Estrada, accompanied by pianist Roger Bingaman. Both well-known and lesser-known songs from the Sondheim catalog will be featured. This concert was rescheduled from its original date in November.

The Fine Arts Committee will present **The Fermi String Quartet on Sunday, April 30 at 2 pm.** The Quartet is an ensemble of four highly experienced Chicago musicians, formed in 2018 to honor Beethoven's 250th anniversary. In addition to their work together as a quartet, these talented artists have performed internationally and with some of America's most important professional orchestras and chamber ensembles. Since 2021, the FSQ has been in residence at the Southern Illinois Music Festival, presenting master classes and performances, as well as performing in the Festival Orchestra. The quartet's

name honors Dr. Enrico Fermi, who first split the atom at the University of Chicago. Fermi String Quartet members include violinists Linda Veleckis Nussbaum and Nina Saito, violist Jessica Lipon and cellist William Cernota.
