## First Wednesdays "Neighbors Night Out"

Michael and Laurie Bish started the monthly "Neighbors Night Out" evening for locals to gather in a social atmosphere. More neighbors who know each other equals more cooperation and a more unified neighborhood.

"This is not a networking event," stated Michael. "We are here to socialize and get to know each other better."

The group meets on the first Wednesday of the month from 5–7 pm at establishments in or near Irving Park. Many people linger after the event to continue socializing. Restaurants or taverns in the area are selected so neighbors can be introduced to them, plus support local businesses.

From a modest start to well over 30 regulars, Neighbors Night Out has met at places such as Old Irving Park Brewery, Hearth and Crust (recently revamped by the owners as Buona Terra Ristorante), Eris Brewery & Cider House, The Cabin at Old Irving Park, Paddy Mac's, and Leona's Pizzeria. 
## Is the market slowing down?

Hi Neighbors! Short answer-yes and no.

There will always be buyers who need to move. Many have adapted to today's higher mortgage rates which range from 6.75% to over 7.5%. Others are waiting until rates to come down. Unfortunately, the days of 3% mortgage rates are gone. Fannie Mae projects mortgage rates will be 6.1% on average in 2024.

Regarding home prices, they have slowed a bit the last few months. But let me clarify. Single family home prices in Irving Park increased 27% in the last 3 years! What's changed is the rate of price increases has slowed. But home prices are stable.

This is largely due to the continuing shortage of homes for sale. There are 32% fewer homes for sale in Irving Park versus last year.





## CAPS Report Beats 1722 & 1723

#### August 16, 2023 Meeting

Via Email from the CAPS office. CAPS Officer Miro stated that the primary topic was community members' concerns about the recent robberies in the area and robbery arrests made by Area 5 detectives. He also addressed crime reduction strategies.

The Office of Community Policing is looking for Beat Facilitators. A Beat Facilitator is a community representative who co-chairs and assists in facilitating community Beat Meetings along with sworn members of Community Policing. The roles of a Beat Facilitator:

- · Represent community residents
- Be a team player and work well with all residents and district police officers
- · Ability to organize and lead a community meeting
- Ability to identify, address community needs and problems and initiate community outreach
- Reside or work in the beat they will represent
- Have basic computer and smartphone skills

#### July 19, 2023 Meeting

**In attendance:** CAPS Officer Miro; John Campos, CPD Community Organizer; Alderman Samantha Nugent and Samantha Brewer, (39th Ward)

Alderman Nugent spoke first since she had to attend another meeting. She reminded attendees about 39th Ward Participatory Budgeting. Voting ends July 24 and projects will be announced August 4. If your basement flooded during July storms, report the damage to 311. Cook County has applied for Federal disaster relief funds (since granted).

Officer Miro announced that Commander Alexa retired. He also reported that most of the theft in Beat 1723 is auto-related, especially thefts of Hyundai and Kias. Officer Miro reported there were 21 arrests over a three-week period in July in Beat 1723 and 13 arrests in Beat 1722.

A resident complained about teens harassing her outside her building at Sunnyside and Kimball and then ducking into a Gary Carlson owned building. Officers will give the area special attention. Another resident complained about a mentally ill woman screaming at night at Lawndale and Montrose. Call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood and provide detailed descriptions of the individuals and vehicles involved in any incident. Even if a neighbor has already reported the incident or activity, other neighbors should make separate calls. The police rely on the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers to a district.

Remember to always lock your vehicle; never leave it running unattended. Be on the lookout for scams related to income tax refunds. Remember, the IRS will never call you on the phone. **The next meeting will be on Wednesday, September 20 at 6:30 pm** in the 17th District Community Room, 4650 N. Pulaski.

#### Welcome Back, Students!


