Oh, Rats! What Can You Do?

Fall is a time to enjoy the changing fall colors, carving pumpkins, and welcoming trick-or-treaters to our homes. But fall is also a time of year when certain creatures are most active-rats!

Chicago is often referred to as the "rattiest" city in the U.S., based on the number of rodent removal jobs completed by pest control services company Orkin. Block Club reported in August that rat complaints have been on the rise, reaching 50,000 last year. Although much of this volume peaked during the pandemic, when more people were spending time at home, the high volume is also creating a giant backlog as the city's Bureau of Rodent Control struggles to keep up with demand.

As rat complaints hover at record highs and wait times for service requests extend further out, it's more important than ever for our West Walker community to take action. Here are easy steps you can take to mitigate the rat issue and prevent infestations at your home and on your block:

- 1. Keep trash bins closed and secure: Overflowing trash or bins not closed? Call 311 or use the Chi 311 app to request a replacement trash bin, get a new bin if yours or your neighbors' bin is broken/has holes, or if you notice overflowing trash.
- **2. Remove food sources:** Don't leave feed on the ground, including pet food and bird seed.
- **3. Maintain outdoor areas:** Trim overgrown vegetation, as rats often use these as hiding spots and pathways. Call 311 or use Chi 311 app to have your yard waste picked up.

If our community follows these steps, we can help curb the rat population together and have a happier, healthier winter and spring!

Dear Neighbor,



CAPS Report Beats 1722 & 1723

September 20, 2023 Meeting

In attendance: CAPS Sgt. Coughlin; CAPS Officer Miro; John Campos, CPD Community Organizer; Alderman Samantha Nugent and Samantha Brewer (39th Ward)

CAPS Officer Miro welcomed everyone to the meeting. Alderman Nugent (39th) spoke first. She announced that Participatory Budgeting is starting up again. Over 1,000 people voted in the last round. The Alderman's office is accepting block party applications through Halloween.

Officer Miro reviewed crime stats for Beat 1723. Most of the batteries in the beat are related to domestic violence and thefts are mostly either retail thefts or catalytic converter thefts. Thefts of Hyundais and Kias continue.

A discussion was held about recent armed robberies. The owner of Gamblers Pub on Pulaski reported that she and the patrons of her bar were held up on August 28. Convenience stores are also being targeted. Sgt. Coughlin said that they are responding to these robberies with focused tactical missions, where tac cars saturate areas where crime patterns are happening.



The remainder of the meeting was occupied by an irate resident who complained at length about the lack of police response to complaints about abandoned vehicles in the Mayfair neighborhood.

The Office of Community Policing is looking for Beat Facilitators. A Beat Facilitator is a community representative who co-chairs and assists in facilitating community Beat Meetings along with sworn members of Community Policing. The roles of a Beat Facilitator:

- · Represent community residents
- Be a team player and work well with all residents and district police officers
- · Ability to organize and lead a community meeting
- · Ability to identify and address community needs and problems, and initiate community outreach
- · Reside or work in the beat they will represent

• Have basic computer and smartphone skills For more information and to apply, visit https://tinyurl.com/beatfacilitator.

Call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood and provide detailed descriptions of the individuals and vehicles involved in any incident. Even if a neighbor has already reported the incident or activity, other neighbors should make separate calls. The police rely on the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers to a district.

Remember to always lock your vehicle; never leave it running unattended. Be on the lookout for scams related to income tax refunds. Remember, the IRS will never call you on the phone. The next meeting will be on Wednesday, October 18 at 6:30 pm in the 17th District Community Room, 4650 N. Pulaski.
