WHAT TO EXPECT IN 2024

On December 13, the Fed announced they will be pausing their interest rate hikes and implied that they may cut interest rates 3 times in 2024.

Here are some experts' predictions for the Chicago 2024 real estate market.

- 1. Mortgage rates may decrease. Depending on your news source (Forbes, US News, NAR, Bankrate), mortgage rates, currently around 7%, could drop to 6% or possibly even 5% in 2024. More Fed rate cuts are expected in 2025.
- 2. More buyers will start looking again. Many home buyers were waiting to purchase in the hopes mortgage rates would come down. The same priced home will cost less & their monthly payment will become a little more affordable with lower mortgage rates.
- **3.** Shortage of homes for sale. Census data and Moody suggest Chicago is currently short around 142,000 homes for sale. However, lower mortgage rates may motivate more sellers to put their homes on the market.
- 4. Competition may increase. With more buyers entering the market, we could see a return of multiple offers if the supply of homes doesn't increase. Some suggest home prices may slightly increase due to supply vs. demand. However, overall, Chicago home prices are projected to increase 1.1%.

Happy New Year! As you start to negotiate through the gauntlet of "NEW YEAR, NEW YOU" initiatives, remember to pause for a reality check.

Although these shiny objects might tempt your wallet, hold on! Before you jump in, let's address the two "D's" that present the biggest hurdles to change:

- 1. Demoralization: Feeling overwhelmed and lacking the motivation to start.
- 2. Defensiveness: Believing you don't have a problem or need to change.

These are signs of the "precontemplation" stage, where:

- You're unaware of the change you need.
- You don't know how to make it happen.
- · You're not ready to commit.
- · You lack resources and motivation.

Most New Year products and services focus on the end result-a shiny new you-without addressing the process. While super enticing, this approach can leave you feeling overwhelmed and unsupported, lending itself to another failed resolution.

This year, skip the "Big Hairy Audacious Goals" and embrace "small D energy" instead. Here's how:

- 1. Set Intentions for Delight: Instead of focusing solely on goals, prioritize experiences that bring joy. This fosters a positive mind-set and opens you up to the benefits of change.
- 2. Decrease Your Cons: Identify the roadblocks that are standing in the way of your goals. Address these obstacles to clear the path ahead. Conduct a SWOT analysis (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats) to help with this stage.

Soprano Alicia Berneche will perform a solo recital February 4 at 2 pm.



Once this exemption is applied, the Assessor's Office auto-renews it for you each year. If a homeowner was eligible for a homestead exemption in tax years 2022, 2021, 2020, 2019, and 2018, and the exemption was not applied to the paid property tax bill, a refund can be obtained through the Certificate of Error process.
