Today's Housing Market Myths

There's a lot of conversation in the media about what's happening in real estate. Some like to stoke fears about a real estate market collapse. Here are some myths and facts to set the record straight.

Myth: Home prices are going to crash.

It's true many markets have seen remarkable appreciation in home values over the last 3 years. The average sale price of a 3 bedroom, 2 bath home in Irving Park is now \$562,000, up 17% since 2021. However, prices are not expected to crash because there is still an under supply of homes for sale. It would take 2.5 months to sell all the Irving Park homes for sale compared to 4.5 months before the pandemic. An oversupply of homes (buyers' market) is more than 5 to 7 months of inventory. The number of foreclosures is also down significantly and homeowners' home equity has increased dramatically.

Myth: It's a sellers' market; I can overprice my home. We're seeing an increase in price reductions, because some Realtors and sellers are overpricing homes based on what they hope the home is worth versus reviewing a thorough analysis of recent sales and discussing what buyers may be willing to pay. Research tells us you get a higher sale price if you price your home at market value from the start, versus multiple price reductions.

Myth: I need to put 20% down to buy a home. According to the National Association of Realtors, first time buyers have a median downpayment of 6% and repeat homebuyers average a 17% downpayment. Source: KCM, NAR


Desire is the driving force behind change. It's the vision of a better you that inspires you to take action. Visualize the positive outcomes of your desired behavior and let that vision fuel your motivation.

Ability is about believing in yourself. Reflect on past successes and seek support from others to boost your self-confidence. Break down your goals into smaller, achievable steps to build momentum. **Reason** is your "why." It's the underlying motivation that keeps you going when things get tough. Connect your goals to your values and priorities to find a meaningful reason to change.

Need is the sense of urgency that drives action. Consider the negative consequences of your current behavior and set deadlines to create a sense of time pressure.

By understanding and applying the DARN principle, you can work through resistance and achieve your health goals. Start by identifying a goal and assessing your desire, ability, reason and need. Remember, it's not about being perfect; it's about progress. So, take the first step today and unleash your own, inner champion.


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


