2024 Real Estate Recap

2024 was a good year for real estate in Irving Park and our neighborhood. Median sale prices increased on average 10%!

It took longer to sell single family homes than condos and multi-family homes.

In Irving Park, through mid-November, here's what we saw versus the same time last year.

Single Family Homes

178 sold in 2024 versus 177 homes sold in 2023.

It took 62 days to sell versus 45 days in 2023.

Median sale price was \$692,500 versus \$622,500 in 2023. Sale prices increased 11%!

Condos/Townhouses

153 sold in 2024 versus 181 sold in 2023.

It took 31 days to sell versus 40 days in 2023.

Median sale price was \$265,000 versus \$242,000 in 2023. Sale prices increased 10%!

2–4 Unit Properties

80 sold in 2024 versus 91 sold in 2023.

It took 31 days to sell versus 54 days in 2023.

Median sale price was \$605,000 versus \$540,000 in 2023. Sale prices increased 12%!

Haugan Elementary Mural Celebrates Indigenous Art

In the spring of 2024, Chicago artist and

instructor Ken Klopack formed a small group of Haugan Elementary student artists who volunteered to work on a mural project to be displayed in the school.

Over 300 migrant children attend Haugan Elementary. Ideas for the mural were drawn from actual symbolic art and fabric designs of indigenous peoples. The student artists worked on the mural from early spring to the end of the 2023-24 school year. Their artists' statement that accompanies the mural reads:


Indigenous Peoples Mural 2024

This artwork represents the art and visual culture of Indigenous Peoples of Southwestern United States, Mexico. Central America. and South America.

We used authentic art elements from these areas to develop our own version. We also included the words "Haugan Hawks" as part of the overall design.



The Irving Park Food Pantry is providing its clients in the 60641 and 60618 ZIP codes with a full holiday meal on December 18, along with gifts for children 12 years old and younger during a special distribution. We're asking for your help with this annual program.

We provide the meal that day to all our regular, eligible clients (those who have visited the Pantry three times this year). The menu comprises meat, sides and dessert for the entire family. This is in addition to the regular array of groceries they'll receive during our three distributions this month (December 4 and 11 from 9 am to noon and December 10 from 6–7 pm; we are closed December 25 and January 1, 2025).

We are asking for monetary donations via PayPal (at www.irvingparkfoodpantry.org) or check (to the Pantry at 4256 N. Ridgeway Ave., Chicago IL 60618) rather than food contributions. We can purchase food from suppliers who give us generous discounts, so your monetary donations give us great purchasing power.

ensures we receive the needed number of items for each age group.


