Christmas and New Year's at St. Edward!

We have an extremely diverse community at St. Edward Parish and School. Our diversity is celebrated this time of year with various celebrations leading up to Christmas!

Every year on **December 12**, Catholics around the world celebrate the apparition of Mary, the mother of Jesus, to a poor young man named Juan Diego. We celebrate this day as the **Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe**. Join us at St. Edward on **Sunday, December 14**, at our **11 am** Mass with music led by a Mariachi Band. Following Mass, there will be a Mexican-inspired lunch in the Unity Hall.

You can then join our Filipino parishioners for their annual **Simbang Gabi** celebration on **Saturday, December 20**, with Holy Mass at **4:30 pm** and delicious Filipino dinner after Mass in Unity Hall.

Following Christmas Day, we will celebrate an **Epiphany Concert** led by our choir on **Sunday, January 4**, at **2 pm** in the Church. This concert is also free and will keep us in the Christmas spirit. Catholics celebrate Christmas through the **Feast of the Baptism of the Lord**, which this year falls on **Sunday, January 11**.

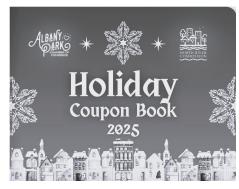

Seasonal Strategies for the Winter Blues

It's happening again: the season we endure to experience the amazingly beautiful spring, summer, and fall days that Chicago has to offer. It's winter, and according to the news cycle (why do they insist on scaring us like this??), it's going to be a doozy.

My clients across the midwest are already feeling that the shorter days, lack of sunlight, and colder temperatures are wreaking havoc on their mental outlook - even after just a few weeks. While **Seasonal Affective Disorder** is a real diagnosis, referring to a type of depression with seasonal patterns, it's not uncommon for many of us to experience a sort of "winter blues" during the colder, darker months. If you, too, have been feeling a little "blue" at the prospect of another winter, here are a few simple and helpful ways to approach the season.

Embrace The Season

Studies in Norway show that people who turn to the colder months with excitement, reverence, and a sense of purpose tend to experience less depression and more satisfaction. Simply put, they infuse the season with meaning and do their best to make the most of it. What does winter mean to you? What activities and routines can you include in your days and weeks to reflect this meaning?

Follow The Lead of The Light

One of the best ways to flow with the season is to follow the sun's rhythm. You don't necessarily need to wake with the sun, but when you do wake, taking 5–10 minutes to step outside and let yourself be in the early morning light will help signal your brain that it's time to be awake. Conversely, turning the lights low in the evening when it's time to wind down will help you adhere to a regular bedtime routine. How will you embrace the natural "hibernation" energy of the season to get some good rest this winter?

Shop Seasonal

It's not only a healthy idea to shop for seasonal produce but also a budget-friendly one. Often, the foods that are in season are those that are harvested at peak ripeness, ensuring that the vitamin and antioxidant

content is high, which can support your immune system. In addition, because of nature's rhythm and the seasonal availability of food, shopping seasonally supports local farmers, ensures abundance, and reduces transportation costs. What seasonal foods or recipes are you excited to try this winter?

These are just a few ways you can start to approach the winter months with a new perspective. Remember that the most effective strategies you use will be those that are interesting to you. Don't be afraid to be creative with the ways in which you plan to approach your own seasonal support this winter.

Keeping Your Dog Healthy & Happy All Winter Long

Chicago winters have plenty of charm but also come with challenges for our dogs. Cold sidewalks, salty streets, dry air, and shorter days can all affect how our pups feel this time of year. A few simple habits can make a big difference in keeping them comfortable and healthy.

Icy sidewalks are a big winter concern. Just like people, dogs can slip and strain joints or muscles, so on the coldest days it helps to take shorter walks and avoid heavily iced areas. Snow and salt are tough on paws. Wiping paws after walks keeps irritation down and protective booties add a helpful barrier. Paw balm is another great addition for winter care since it protects and moisturizes paw pads. It can also soothe dry noses, skin patches, hotspots, and skin folds.



Some pups love to burst into full snow zoomies, but it is important to watch for shivers, freezing paws, or hesitation that signal it is time to head inside. Short haired and small breed dogs also lose heat more quickly so a coat or sweater can keep them more comfortable. While many dogs love to snack on snow, it can contain salt, antifreeze, or debris, so it's best to supervise or redirect them with a treat or toy.

Because many dogs are less active in winter, they may burn fewer calories. Keep an eye on their body condition and adjust food or treats if needed. Shorter days also mean darker morning and evening walks so reflective gear, LED collars, and light up leashes help keep both pups and parents visible to drivers and cyclists.



Winter often means less outdoor exercise which can lead to extra energy or boredom. Social interaction helps dogs release that energy in a healthy way. 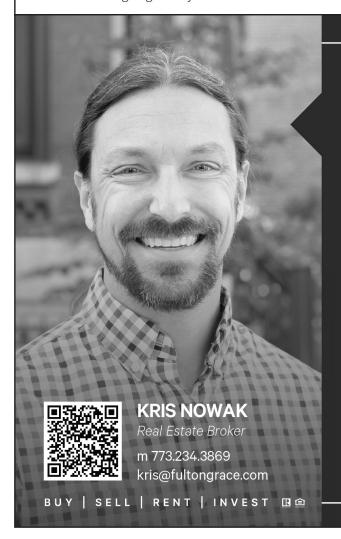
