2026 West Walker Garden Walk Shows Growth in Community and Plants

On a sun-drenched Sunday afternoon, over 110 neighbors and visitors strolled through West Walker's tree-lined streets, admiring 18 gardens that showcased our area's botanical diversity. From community food gardens to pollinator sanctuaries, the second biennial West Walker Garden Walk showed that residents are transforming their urban spaces with creativity and care.



Participants meandered along a charted garden walk route spanning North and South of Elston, with stops along Avers, Lawndale, Monticello, Hamlin, and Springfield. Gardens ranged from Andrea Macias's front-yard community garden rooted in food justice, to Marilyn Pauga's veteran tribute garden blooming with poppies and milkweed. Visitors discovered lovingly tended fairy gardens, organic bird sanctuaries, Zen spaces with water features, raised vegetable beds, and shade gardens featuring native plants. The Carlson Community Services' Three Brothers Garden on Pulaski, a volunteer-managed community garden that donates its harvest to the Irving Park Community Food Pantry, demonstrated gardening in service of neighborhood food security.

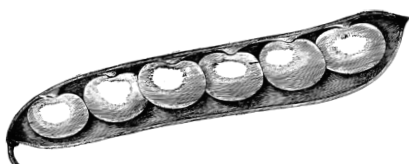
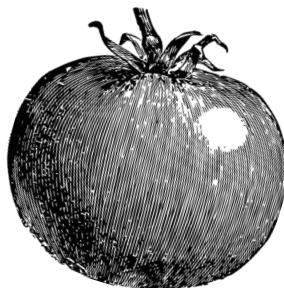
Area farmers' markets are still going strong until October! Don't miss your chance to get the freshest produce, honey, cheese, and more!

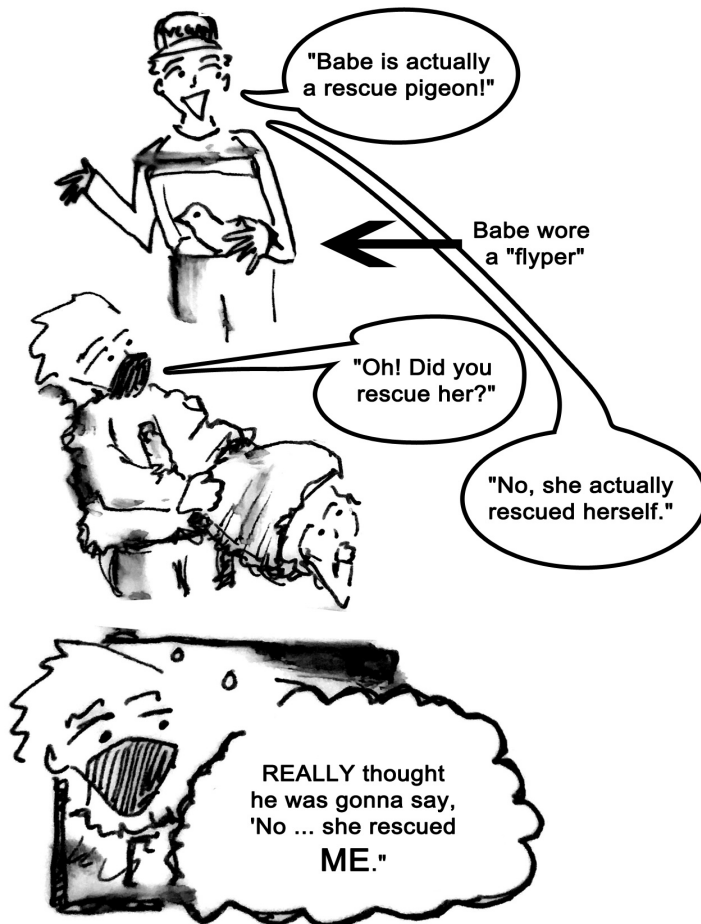
The Notch Studio

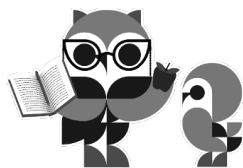

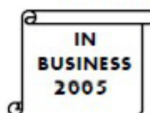
